About This Project

IMPROVEMENTS

Beginning May 2021, Halton Region will be upgrading and rehabilitating the Bailie Booster Pumping Station and Reservoir on Guelph Line (Regional Road 1), between Longmeadow Road and Highway 407 ETR, Ward 6, in the City of Burlington (see attached map for project location). This work is required to maintain our drinking water systems in a state of good repair and to ensure continued water delivery to residents in the City of Burlington. Improvements will include the following upgrades:

- Replacement of pumps, valves and piping inside the pumping station building, and
- Replacement of waterproofing membrane on the roof of reservoir cell 1 and cell 2.

The contractor for this project is Sona Construction Limited with project administration by Associated Engineering (Ont.) Limited. The majority of the construction works are anticipated to be completed by the end of 2022 followed by the restoration phase in spring 2023 (where all impacted areas will be restored to at least current conditions).

Please note, public access to the reservoir / green space area will be restricted for the duration of construction.

Prior to the start of construction, OZA Inspections Limited will be surveying all buildings near the construction area in order to verify and document existing conditions. The survey will protect property owners in the event that damage occurs during construction.





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Your property is located within the limits of the project that are being recommended to be surveyed. There is no cost to residents or property owners for this service. The survey includes; an interior/exterior inspection, including; photographs of buildings and structures (or portions thereof). The inspection typically takes about an hour to complete and will require someone to be at your home to let the inspector inside. All OZA Inspections limited inspectors carry photo identification.

PLANNING AHEAD

To help you plan ahead for construction activity, please read the project related information below. Wherever possible, mitigation plans will be put in place to minimize disruptions.

Dust and mud: There may be increased levels of dust and mud near the work site. The contractor is required to manage these impacts.

Erosion and sediment controls: We will install erosion and sediment control measures for the duration of the project, including a tree protection fence with heavy-duty silt fabric around the perimeter of the project site.

Night work: Night work is not anticipated for this this project, but if it will be required, we will provide advance notice of any change in work hours.

Noise: You may experience noise as a result of these improvements. We will schedule work in accordance with local noise by-laws.

Truck traffic: You will notice occasional increases in truck traffic around the ongoing work. Please be aware and use extra caution while driving.

Tree removals: To accommodate the replacement of the reservoir waterproofing, a certified arborist will remove several trees. Some pruning of hazardous trees and limbs may be required. Replacement trees will be planted within the reservoir site.



Coronavirus (COVID-19) Preventative Measures

Dear Resident/Property Owner,

OZA is taking precautions to prevent the spread of the virus and to protect our employees and the public.

Our inspector protocol includes hygiene measures, in particular frequent hand sanitizing, and refraining from contact with surfaces during the inspection; we request that you open any doors/gates etc. as necessary to facilitate the inspection. Furthermore, we are practicing physical distancing, ideally a 2 metre separation. Inspectors will wear a mask and/or face shield for all interior inspections and for in person communication and exterior inspections when physical distancing is not possible. Inspectors do not report for work if experiencing any symptoms of illness.

Towards our employees safety and to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19, we ask that you advise us prior to booking an inspection and that you notify us prior to our inspector access to your property if <u>any</u> of the following is true:

- 1. You have travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days.
- 2. You have symptoms such as fever, coughing and/or difficulty breathing.
- You or any person in your building has been exposed to a person who has a confirmed or probable case of the COVID-19 infection and/or you are self isolating.
