The First Congregational Church of Madison

January 2022

Depending on which date you choose to hang your claim on, the First Congregational Church of Madison was founded in either 1703 or 1707. That puts 70 or so years older than the country.

This makes us part of the second or third generation of churches in New England. All of which is to say that we come from an old and venerable tradition; one that dates from the English Reformation of the late 16th and 17th centuries.

Historically, we are the descendants of the Puritans, that sometimes radical and often misunderstood group of English Reformers who first settled New England in the years following the great Puritan migration of the 1630's. Throughout the history of our tradition, we have held to the understanding the church is not a building, never reduced to the confines of physical space; but rather a gathering of people in the presence of the Word, the Bible, to worship God.

Thus, the designation Meeting House to describe the building in which we gather. The church is the people, the Meeting House the space in which the congregation creates a time set aside for worship alone.

Over the past couple of years, we have discussed ways in which we can more clearly establish boundaries for sacred time, our hour of worship. In January, we will be trying out one way to create a more manifest sense of worship as a sacred time set aside from common time.

So beginning with Epiphany Sunday on January 9, people in worship will see something a little new, as a member of the congregation will open 'worship' by carrying a Bible into the sanctuary and up to the pulpit. This will be followed by a brief call to worship. At the close of worship, following the Benediction, the Bible will be carried, returning the space to common use.

The hope, of course, is to help us see the hour in which we gather as sacred time, as Sabbath, when we set aside the cares and worries of our larger life, to give a little space to the worship of God and to allow us a greater access to the peace that comes from giving ourselves to God.

Pursuant to the by-laws of the Church:






Your Pledge will help us "Soar with the Spirit" in 2022

SING FOR ADVENT AND/OR CHRISTMAS EVE!

As in past years, anyone who would like to sing with the Adult Choir during Advent and/or for the 8:00 pm Christmas Eve service is welcome to start attending Thursday evening rehearsals in Hubley Hall from 7:00-8:30 pm. **Any interested singers are requested to start attending no later than Thursday, December 2nd.**

The pieces the Adult Choir will be singing are absolutely beautiful and very moving. *In the Silence, Wondrous Love* by Ruth Elaine Schram incorporates the familiar Advent hymn *Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence* as well as *What Wondrous Love Is This*, a hymn typically associated with Lent but cleverly and appropriately woven into this superb anthem. *Watchman, Tell Us of the Night* by Alan Hovhaness is an intricate, four-part anthem with a fantastic bass solo which will be sung by Peter Hawkins. *God With Us* by Matthew Gwronski was written in 2018 and is pretty radical departure from what the Adult Choir typically sings. The three-part, close harmonies are truly stunning and magnificently set to the text. "...But the darkness has not understood that the Light would shine into the darkest parts of me. Emmanuel, God with us!"




Christmas Pageant
