Making Kindness Contagious

Over the past year, through a grant from the Lilly Foundation and Yale Divinity School, Jordan Syler gathered several members of the church to spend a few months discerning and dreaming about how First Church could continue to build on our abundant strengths—and perhaps find new ways of reaching out beyond our doors to inspire something in our wider community.

The group included Kevin Kane, Mary Olson, Carol Robbins and Katy Webb. Together they developed the theme of improving the relational life of the Church by addressing loneliness and social disconnection in our own midst. In addition, they discussed a book by Vivek Murthy, MD, the US Surgeon General, entitled, Together: The Healing Power of Human Connection in a Sometimes Lonely. Murthy describes what he calls the "epidemic of loneliness" in America, finding that loneliness and isolation lead to a variety of physical health issues.

As Mary Olson observed, we human beings are wired for social connection. Murthy not only makes the case for widespread loneliness in the United States as a public health emergency but, he also describes unique outcomes in those places where communities have found sustainable solutions to reduce loneliness and isolation. Among them is the culture of kindness established in Anaheim, California. This cultural shift began as the result of a mysterious poster campaign on walls scattered around the city. A family grieving the tragic loss of a young daughter found that she had left behind a collection of beautiful notes about the importance of kindness. Natasha's notes inspired her father to create and hang posters around the city reading, simply, "Make Kindness Contagious." The posters sparked a fascinating series of events. Anaheim's mayor, Tom Tait campaigned on a platform of creating a culture of kindness and won by a wide margin.

Our Reimagining Church Team was inspired by this and hopes that First Church can imagine ways of *Making Kindness Contagious* in the coming year by fostering a deeper sense of belonging and building a more robust culture of kindness, both in our church and in the broader community. And hopefully, as has been the case in other places, the simple commitment to practicing kindness will have a radiating effect. What begins with us with infect the life of our communities and allow all of us to reimagine the power that kindness has to heal the things that currently isolate and divide us. We look forward to what will come next.




Welcome back to choir season! We would love for you to join one or more of our ensembles.

• **TREBLE CHOIR:** All the children of the church grades pre-K to fourth grade have the opportunity to learn music on Sunday mornings. • SPIRIT CHOIR: The ultimate in flexibility and simplicity! FCC Madison has been particularly fortunate to have a great team of people working over the past three years to improve our physical space. Led by our past Chair, Cathy Hopkins, Properties has installed new floors in the downstairs offices and meeting rooms of the Church House, improved the environmental quality by installing split units in our offices, completed a renovation of the space under the sanctuary, creating fresh new spaces for our Church School, completed a physical assessment of the Meetinghouse, and is currently in the process of renovating our church kitchen. In addition to Cathy's tremendous leadership, we are grateful to Garry Leonard for securing in excess of \$100,000 in state and Federal grants, to Bob Blake who is serving as the manager of the kitchen project, Ken Dreier and our current chair Lyle Holmberg for their work on bringing solar panels to the Church House. We are grateful to each of you for all your work on behalf of First Congregational Church.

RENOVATIONS, RENOVATIONS, RENOVATIONS

This summer First Congregational Church will embark on a series of upgrades to our facilities in the Franklin Bower Church House. Over the past few years, our Properties Committee has worked very hard to improve the downstairs level of the building, installing new floors and split-unit heating and air-conditioning units throughout, vastly improving the work environment for our staff.

Their work continues this summer with a complete renovation of our kitchen. This timely and essential improvement is made possible by an extraordinarily generous gift from a church member. This new kitchen will provide us with more opportunities for fellowship, of course; but also with the possibility of hosting a soup kitchen and other community events. We hope it will also make possible a new source of revenue, as a commercial kitchen might be made available as rental space for catered events.

In addition to the kitchen, Properties is also working to bring solar panels to the Church House roof, which would make us more energy independent. And later this year, we will replace the old furnace in the Meetinghouse with a liquid propane system that should reduce our cost and provide a much more environmentally friendly source of heat. We are grateful to Garry Leonard for his work on accessing state grants that will cover 50% of the costs of this new system.

Again, we owe a great debt of thanks to Cathy Hopkins and all the members of Properties for the gift of their experience, talent and for the enormous amount of time they have devoted to these projects.

Finally, we are grateful to the small, dedicated group of people who will be redecorating the Parlor this summer. It is a space that has served our church so well for so many years, but some of the furnishings have begun to break down as things do over time, and so the season has come to imagine a new look for the Parlor to serve the next generations of the church.

As an additional note, the church kitchen will be closed for renovation beginning in very early July. If you have any materials in the kitchen, we will have them moved to the stage in Hubley Hall.

The large and small refrigerators in the kitchen will also be moved to Hubley Hall.

During the summer, we will have Lemonade on the Lawn as always in the garden next to the Meeting House.
