

# Hosanna, Loud Hosanna


1. Ho - san - na, loud ho - san - na, the lit - tle chil - dren sang;

 for Christ is our Re - deem - er, the Lord of heav'n, our King.






1. <sup>1</sup>O praise the LORD, for He is good; His stead-fast love en-dures.
