I. **Thou shalt have no other gods before me.**

II. **Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image,**

or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the LORD thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; and showing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.

And the second is like unto it: Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets. (Matthew 22:37-40)

<sup>12</sup> “All things are lawful for me,” but not all things are helpful. “All things are lawful for me,” but I will not be dominated by anything.

<sup>13</sup> “Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food”—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. <sup>14</sup> And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. <sup>15</sup> Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never!

<sup>16</sup> Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, “The two will become one flesh.”

**VETERANS DAY**

On the eleventh day of the eleventh month of 1918, guns fell silent and the “Great War,” now known as the First World War, ended. Total military and civilian casualties numbered about 40 million, including between 15 and 19 million killed. American casualties were over 116,000 killed, 204,000 wounded. Just 21 years later war erupted again as Germany invaded Poland, beginning what would become an even bloodier and more destructive Second World War. Following the war, Armistice Day, commemorating the end of the First, gave way to Veterans Day, commemorating the sacrifices of all who have served in America’s armed forces. We join with the whole nation today in giving thanks, both to our veterans and those currently serving in the armed forces, for their role in protecting our lives and liberties.




