Finding Your Federal Elected Officials

<u>President</u> – Contact the President online at https://www.whitehouse.gov or call the White House comments line at 202-456-1111 during business hours, 9 am to 5 pm. You can also sign up for their updates on the first page. Their site includes information on the Administration, Presidential Actions, Briefing Room and Live Coverage of Events.

<u>Federal Senate Officials</u> – U.S. Senators can be found at https://www.senate.gov. If you live in South Carolina, Senator Lindsey Graham's low country office is at 4 Carriage Lane, Suite 401, Charleston, SC 29407. <u>Federal District Representative(s)</u> – To find your Congressperson, visit https://www.house.gov and put in your zip code in the top right-hand box on page.

Note: Each of your representatives has a website with helpful information such as their priorities, committee assignments and a place to sign up for newsletters. There is also a comment section that you can use to convey your views. If you prefer to do this by mail, their office address is generally on the bottom of the page on their website. If you are interested in sharing your views with one or all of your elected officials, submitting your comments with personal experiences and stories is generally most effective.
