Health Care	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Extending the American Rescue Plan's (ARP) expansion of the Affordable Care Act (ACA).</li> <li>Addressing the Medicaid coverage gap.</li> <li>Expanding Medicare to include dental, vision, and hearing benefits.</li> <li>Lowering the Medicare eligibility age.</li> <li>Addressing health care provider shortages and Graduate Medical Education.</li> <li>Funding to support access to primary care, including Community Health Centers, the National Health Service Corps, the Nurse Corps, and Teaching Health Center Graduate Medical Education.</li> <li>Boosting home and community-based services for seniors and people with disabilities.</li> <li>Investing in new maternal, behavioral, and racial justice health equity initiatives.</li> <li>Funding for future pandemic preparedness efforts.</li> <li>Health-related funding offsets, including prescription drug pricing reform.</li> </ul>
Tax Reform	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Corporate and international tax reform.</li> <li>Increasing the tax rate for high-income individuals.</li> <li>Bolstering IRS enforcement efforts.</li> <li>Extending the Child Tax Credit (CTC), Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), and Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit (CDCTC).</li> <li>Tax credits for clean energy, manufacturing, and transportation.</li> <li>Adjusting the cap on the state and local tax (SALT) deduction.</li> </ul>
Education & Child Care	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Universal pre-kindergarten for 3 and 4-year olds.</li> <li>Funding to support child care for working families.</li> <li>Two years of tuition-free community college.</li> <li>Investments in various minority-serving institutions.</li> <li>Expanding child nutrition programs.</li> <li>Funds for school infrastructure, student success grants, and educators.</li> <li>Increasing the maximum Pell grant award.</li> </ul>

<b>Housing</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Investments in the Housing Trust Fund, HOME Investment Partnerships, the Capital Magnet Fund, and rural housing.</li> <li>• Providing assistance for down payments, rental costs, and other home ownership initiatives.</li> <li>• New funding for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program.</li> <li>• Zoning and land use reforms.</li> <li>• Public housing capital investments, including a focus on sustainability.</li> </ul>
<b>Workforce</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paid family and medical leave.</li> <li>• Supporting workforce development and job training initiatives.</li> <li>• New “pro-worker” incentives.</li> <li>• <u>Labor enforcement and penalties for illicit labor practices.</u></li> </ul>
