The hope is that the awards may serve as inspiration or as best management practices for local government officials throughout Pennsylvania.

This year, Thomas A. Zeuner, Executive Director of Northampton Bucks County Municipal Authority, has been given the distinguished Career Recognition Award.

Tom has been with the Northampton Bucks County Municipal Authority for 20 years, 15 of those years serving as Executive Director and is the immediate past President of the Pennsylvania Municipal Authorities Association (PMAA) and a past Region 1 Director.

He also serves on the PMAA Conference Committee, Executive Committee, Legislative Committee, the Unemployment Compensation Trustees and, on behalf of PMAA, serves on the Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) Advisory Committee.

"Local government plays a huge role in the lives of all Pennsylvanians," said C. Kim Bracey, Executive Director for the Governor's Center for Local Government Services. "The work our award recipients do every day makes a difference in their communities and your legacy is in the lives they have impacted."

Tom began his career in a privately held business designing and manufacturing electro-hydraulic control valves for the agricultural harvesting market.

He is credited with seven United States patents with corresponding foreign registration in the field of hydraulics, electro-hydraulics, and fluid power. At the age of 34, he was elected and served on the Northampton Township Board of Supervisors. He served as a board member of the Bucks County Opportunity Council for four years, and board member of the Bucks County Community College Foundation for 17 years.
