Help us to create an open-hearted, non-judgmental church home where spiritual seekers are welcome, especially those searching for deeper meaning in their lives, who want to develop their spiritual side, and who want to explore their faith questions without prescriptive answers. Help us to give them a place of hope, inspiration, love and support for their journey.

Going out into the World

We give thanks for your gifts of faith, love, and hope, and commit to using those gifts as we engage with one another and with the wider community.

You have blessed us with a congregation comprised of individuals with resolve, talent, and enthusiasm. Help us to nurture them here with us, that they may offer these gifts in the world.

We pray especially for our members in care facilities who have been unable to have visitors for the last three months, and for their families and friends who want to be with them but cannot. May your loving presence comfort them, as we do our best to help and support them.

Social Justice

We hear your call to do justice, love kindness and walk humbly, leading us to healing of ourselves and others, empowered by the Christ in all.

Give us the courage to be bold in our conversation. Let us live the story of your "Good News" through our caring and sharing within our community here and abroad. We pray that this, your church, may be a place where disciples are created and empowered, and that we, as your faithful and humble servants, become catalysts for social justice on the Peninsula and beyond.

Guide us as we contemplate and listen for the needs of this new world. Show us how to change and adapt as we engage with the challenges of poverty, homelessness, marginalization, and our own position of privilege in our society.
