

## Good News From Father Daniel... *Second Sunday of Advent*

Our second reading from St Paul's letter to the Romans, tells us that the Gentiles praise God for the mercy God has shown them. According to Jewish Law and tradition, salvation was only for the Jews. St Peter crossed that barrier when he was called by the Holy Spirit to go to Cornelius's house. Cornelius was a Roman and yet the Holy Spirit came upon him and his entire household.

This is an important model for us, my dear brothers and sisters. Just as the people of St Paul's day had to put aside their previous understanding of how God operates, we too have to be open to the way the Spirit is moving in our church today. There are changes occurring. It isn't new doctrine, but a clearer understanding of what has been there all along. For example, Pope Francis has pointed us to the radical nature of God's forgiveness. He has said that capital punishment is morally wrong. Changes to the catechism are underway.

A new understanding can be troubling if we believe that there can be no changes to what has been previously taught. However, all of our tradition has been a gradual unfolding of insight into what it means to live for God. The Truth of God's loving nature does not change. What *can* change is how we apply that Truth to our daily decisions.

At Church of the Ascension, we have chosen to put aside differences and live as family. Those of us who went to the Holy Land this year saw this in action. Our tour guide was Jewish and our driver was Palestinian. The tour company employs people from Jordan, Israel and Palestine. They work together and help solve issues together. I pray that people all over can learn from this model: to dialogue, listen, care and support. We are not all the same, but we can support each other.



### Responding to God's Invitation to Be Still

A few weeks ago, we asked you to share how you have responded to God's invitation to Be Still. Here are some of your responses:



When things are troubling me, I close my eyes and breathe, knowing that God is near and I say to myself: He is in control. Being still reminds me of that.

By being still it allows me to hear God talking to me when I am troubled. He assures me that He is with me and slowly gives me the answer to what to do through hope and trust.

As weeks go by as I look for a job or wait for an offer, I leave it all to the will of the Lord to give me a sign to continue looking or change directions in what I am to do.

I have been slowly reading Father Breindel's book. First I read the "readings" and then the homily that accompanies the readings. Usually only succeeding in completing 2 homilies a week. That time makes me stop and reflect on the word when I would not have done so otherwise.

I respond very well when it is 3 or 4 AM and no interruptions. Be still and know that I am God.

Several times a day I stop and take a few deep breaths and think about how much God has given to me. It gives me the peace and energy to move to the next item in my day.

By being still, we can open our minds and hear God speak to us. Concentrate on the world around us.

By taking the time to be still in God's presence each day, I am more aware of his grace and spirit in the moments during my day. And this encourages me to continue to look for his presence and continue to be faithful to daily prayer. How else can we endure this crazy world?

It is really hard to be still - but that time when I am in a hurry - rushing - that is the time I tell myself to slow down - look around and breathe. Be quiet and listen - calm down and let the presence of the Holy Spirit give me peace. And then I smile. Jesus - I trust in you.
