Dear Friends,

There are times in our news cycle where it seems like all around us is in chaos. I have recently read some thoughts about chaos theory. One small component of a very complex (much of which is beyond my mental capacity) is that when a butterfly flaps its wings, the result can be a tornado in another part of the world. This has been the focus of study by MIT mathematician and meteorologist Edward Norton Lorenz. In part, the insignificant flap of the wings brings about the initial conditions of an interconnected complex web, resulting in conditions that bring about large, life changing storms. What little I understand is that one small gesture can have a cumulative effect that changes the world.

Jesus seemed to like small gestures that changed the world: a widow's mite, a grain of wheat, a pinch of salt, a bit of yeast, a gesture of inclusion, all of which bring about a larger blessing. It is similar to the financial gifts that we put in these envelopes and send back to the Chatham UMC. Gifts both small and large, when pooled together, have an impact throughout the world. In many ways, the small ripples we make when we give to God's work, become larger waves of compassion, justice and joy felt throughout the world.
