\$ _____ **Chatham UMC RISE Youth Teams:** For the past 40+ years, Chatham UMC has sent youth on RISE to help make homes in northern Appalachia safer, warmer, and drier. The youth pay a certain amount to participate. The balance of the costs are covered by donations, fundraisers, and some grants. In years past, Chatham UMC youth have had to raise upwards of \$10,000 to cover the costs of building supplies, rental vans, transportation costs, room and board, and fees to the RISE Board. Thank you for your generosity and partnership in this long-standing ministry of the Chatham UMC.

\$ _____ **UMCOR: Earthquake Relief in Turkey and Syria:** A 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck southern Turkey on Monday, Feb. 6, 2023. Tens of thousands of lives have been lost. The earthquake also heavily impacted northwest Syria, where 4.1 million people depend on humanitarian assistance. United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) has released initial solidarity grants to longstanding partner, International Blue Crescent (IBC) and Forum for Development Culture and Dialogue (working in Syria) to help provide tents, heaters, blankets, warm clothes, ready to eat meals and first aid kits to those who have been displaced. A long-standing UMCOR partner, IBC, has multiple offices and project sites in Turkey. With the devastating damage to roads, transport and infrastructure, IBC has received hundreds of families in its Kilis Community Center for shelter, warm items, and hot meals since the first hours after the quake. Kilis is also serving as a major hub for coordination and relief efforts, including for cross-border response into Syria.
