Interesting facts about money

- It takes 454 dollar bills to equal one pound.
- \$1 bills typically last only 18 months.
- The U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing began producing banknotes in 1869, which had been made by private companies until then.
- Each year, more Monopoly money is printed than real money.
- The name of the man whose picture is on the Monopoly game is Rich Uncle Pennybags.
- The largest bill ever made in the U.S. was \$100,000
- A penny costs more than 1 cent to make.
- In 2015, the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) collected over \$700,000 in unclaimed money left behind, mostly coins.
