REQUIRED SUMMER READING: (Due on the first day of school, August 12, 2025) Entering Kindergarten:

<u>Book:</u> Goldilocks and the Three Bears by Jan Brett (ISBN: 0698113586)
<u>Assignment</u>: Create an illustration of the beginning, middle, and ending of the story.

Entering 1st Grade:

<u>Book:</u> Peter Rabbit by Beatrix Potter (ISBN: 0-448-43521-7)
<u>Assignment</u>: Create an illustration of the beginning, middle, and ending of the story.

On each illustration label the characters.

Entering 2nd Grade:

Book: Stone Soup by Marcia Brown (ISBN: 9780689711039)

<u>Assignment</u>: Create an illustration depicting the virtue of charity from the story. Write a 3 sentence caption about the virtue of charity in the story and why it is important.

Entering 3rd Grade:

<u>Book:</u> Homer Price by Robert McCloskey (ISBN: 978-0142404157)

<u>Assignment:</u> Choose a story / case that was most humorous to you.

Describe the case and explain what was humorous in the story. Be sure to give your answer in a 3-4 sentences paragraph.

Entering 4th Grade:

<u>Book:</u> The Cricket in Times Square by George Selden (ISBN: 978-0312380038) <u>Assignment</u>: Write a separate paragraph of 3-4 sentences for each of the following:

- Choose an obstacle the cricket had to overcome and summarize that obstacle. (paragraph 1)
- What lessons did he learn from this challenge? (paragraph 2)

Entering 5th Grade:

<u>Book:</u> The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe by C.S. Lewis (ISBN: 978-0064471046)

<u>Assignment</u>: In the story, Edmund asks the question, "Which is the right side? How do we know that the fauns are in the right and the Queen in the wrong?" How does one know when something is right or wrong? Please write your essay in response to Edmund's questions in the form of a three paragraph essay. A well-written paragraph has a topic sentence, 3-4 supporting facts or details from the text, and a closing sentence.

Entering 6th Grade:

<u>Book:</u> The Phantom Tollbooth by Norton Juster (ISBN: 978-0394820378)

<u>Assignment:</u> Why would Norton Juster choose a boy like Milo to be the hero of the novel? Please respond in a three paragraph essay. A well-written paragraph has a topic sentence, 3-4 supporting facts or details from the text, and a closing sentence.

Entering 7th Grade:

<u>Book:</u> The Voyage of the Dawn Treader by C.S. Lewis (ISBN: 978-0064405027)

<u>Assignment:</u> Based on what we know of Eustace in the book, how does one become a dragon? What can be learned from Eustace's character and choices that would inevitably lead to becoming monstrous? Write a one page essay that includes specific quotes and examples from the text.

Entering 8th Grade:

<u>Book:</u> Animal Farm by George Orwell (ISBN: 9780451526342)

<u>Assignment</u>: Near the end of the story, The Seven Commandments are reduced to one single Commandment: 'All Animals are equal but some are more equal than others.' Write a one-page essay reflecting on what this change means and what it is communicating to the animals of Animal Farm.
