

# Calculating Your GPA

- Fulton County uses a 100-point scale
- Core vs. Cumulative
- Weighted vs. Unweighted
- HOPE Scholarship GPA Calculator is located on GA Futures
  - ***GA Futures Website***
  - ***Shortcuts***
  - ***Your HOPE GPA***
- Default reporting GPA should be the cumulative, weighted numeric average unless the application requests otherwise
- Do not recalculate to a 4.0 scale for your applications



**Fulton County does not rank students**

**You will select 'does not rank' or 'no ranking' on any application that asks for your rank or what percentile of the graduating class you are in**

# Testing – Fee Waivers

- Each counseling office will have SAT and ACT Fee Waivers
- Students using the Common Application can also apply for a fee waiver through their website and application portal

## **Eligibility Requirements:**

- Must be enrolled in/eligible for the National School Lunch Program
- Annual family income falls within the Income Eligibility Guidelines set by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service.
- You are enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students for low-income families.
- Your family receives public assistance.
- You live in federally subsidized housing, a foster home, or are homeless.
- You are a ward of the state or an orphan.

If you meet the financial requirements to qualify for a fee waiver, reach out to your assigned counselor!



# Junior Timeline

- Create Initial List of colleges you are interested in
  - Final list should be **balanced** (Reach, Target, and Safety schools)
- Make a Testing Plan (SAT or ACT)
  - Applerouth has a free diagnostic available to see your best fit
- Begin college visits and meet with college representatives that visit Milton
  - View & sign up for rep visits in Naviance
- Start working on creating an Academic Resume
  - Write down everything you have done since 9<sup>th</sup> grade
  - Use the method of tracking that you prefer
- Begin working on college essay/personal statement
  - Prompts usually don't change, so brainstorm early!
- Register with the NCAA Eligibility Center if you intend to play sports in college
- Begin compiling a portfolio if you plan on pursuing Fine Arts

# Junior Timeline

## Making a College List

- Make an Initial List of schools
  - Use BigFuture on College Board
  - Use Naviance College Search Tool
- Establish your priority schools
- Research the schools, the application process, and dates/deadlines during the summer before Senior year
- Look at the school's current Freshman Profile
- Evaluate Fit
- Refine College List
  - Balanced list of 7-9 Schools
    - 1-2 Reach – Student has lower GPA, SAT/ACT, etc. than needed for admission
    - 4-5 Target – Admitted students have same GPA, SAT/ACT, etc.
    - 2-3 Safety – Student exceeds admissions requirements

# Junior Timeline

## College Visits

### Campus Tours

- Schedule your visit through the College Admissions office/Website
- See more of the campus
- Try to schedule a time to visit when school is in full session
- Avoid visiting over Spring Break

### Virtual Campus Tours

- Colleges are still offering virtual tours
- Visit their website for availability and additional information

### Milton Rep Visits

- Students can sign up for visits at Milton through 'Naviance Rep Visits'
- Visits are virtual during advisement


Most visits will be virtual on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays during Advisement. Some in-person meetings will be offered this year.



# Georgia MATCH

- Determines eligibility into University System of Georgia (USG) public colleges and universities based on HOPE GPA from 9<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> grade (with exception of University of Georgia, Georgia Tech, and Georgia College & State University)
- Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC) sends letters home to all seniors in October
- Students may not receive a letter if they do not match with any schools
- Students would still need to apply to schools; however, this gives students a good idea if they would qualify for admission

# Financial Aid

## FAQs

### **1. I probably don't qualify for aid, should I apply anyway?**

Yes! Most families don't think they qualify, but they do, and you need to file to get specific loans.

### **2. Do I have to reapply for financial aid every year?**

Yes! Most schools will send a renewal application after the first year. Material changes will have an impact.

### **3. What is the earliest date I can submit my financial aid paperwork?**

Typically, October 1 of Senior year

### **4. Do I need to start the financial aid process before Senior Year?**

Yes! You need to know your financial situation before you start looking at schools. If you can lower your EFC, you need to start as early as Sophomore year.

### **5. What is Merit-Based vs. Need-Based Aid?**

Merit-Based is earned through accomplishments, Need-Based is Earned through financial circumstances.



# Financial Aid

## **Georgia's HOPE Program**

HOPE (Helping Outstanding Pupils Educationally) is Georgia's unique scholarship and grant program that rewards students with financial assistance in degree, diploma, and certificate programs at eligible Georgia public and private colleges and universities, and public technical colleges

### **Qualifications:**

- Be a U.S. citizen and legal resident of Georgia
- Be a graduate of an eligible high school and meet academic achievement standards
- Be in compliance with Selective Service registration requirements (male students)

### **Application:**

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) each year
- Complete the Georgia Student Finance Application (GSFAPPS)

**Additional college-specific application and deadline requirements may be required. Check with your postsecondary institution.**

**If you are interested in obtaining HOPE or Zell Miller, you must take four rigorous courses by the time you graduate.**

- Use your transcript in IC and count your rigor courses
- Reach out to your counselor if you need assistance

# Financial Aid

## Georgia's HOPE Program

- This is your skinny, ugly, GPA
- Final calculations are conducted by GA Student Finance Commission after student graduates from high school
- ALL core classes are used for the calculation (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language)
- Middle School courses are not used when calculating the HOPE/ZELL GPA
- 7-point weight for Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment courses is removed
- GPAs are not rounded (2.9999 is not a 3.0)

Check [www.gafutures.org](http://www.gafutures.org) to view your Preliminary HOPE GPA and to see the rigor courses that are counting towards the 4-credit Rigor Requirement.
