We are sending this out to ensure you have the latest information and active links for you and your student and we prepare for the opening of school on **MONDAY, AUGUST 5, 2024**.

COMMON QUESTIONS:

SCHOOL HOURS FOR STUDENTS

- The school will open for students at 7:30AM daily.
- The school day **STARTS at 8:20AM**.
- Arriving to school AFTER 8:20AM means the student is TARDY for school.
- FCS provides bus transportation for ALL STUDENTS (this helps lessen the drop-off traffic)

COUNSELOR ASSIGNMENTS & AVAILABILITY

Milton Counseling is looking forward to a great 2024-2025 School Year! We anticipate the release of schedules to the Infinite Campus Parent Portal on **Monday, July 29**.

In an effort to adjust student schedules prior to the first day of school, we will host a **Schedule Adjustment Day on Tuesday, July 30**. Students and/or parents should report to the school during the designated time frames below IF there are any discrepancies (listed below) in the student schedule:

- Seniors (12th) report from **8:30-10:30 AM**
- Juniors (11th) report from **10:30-12:30 PM**
- Freshmen (9th) and Sophomores (10th) report from **1:30-3:30 PM**

Please report during your designated time frame to minimize long wait times in the building. If you are unable to come to the school on July 30, the paper schedule adjustment request process will still occur from August 5-August 16. You can submit your request via paper form when school starts. Our goal is to make as many adjustments as possible prior to the first day of school to ensure a smooth start of classes for our students. We do not take schedule adjustment requests via walk-in, phone, or email.

As a reminder, the following items are VALID schedule adjustment requests:

- You need to drop down in rigor
- You have a hole in your schedule
- You previously passed the course
- You have a duplicate course on the schedule
- You have not taken and/or passed the necessary prerequisite course
- You need a course to graduate (Seniors only)
- You need a course for college admission (Seniors only)
- You wish to drop a course as part of the Senior Reduced Courseload (Seniors only, additional form required)



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The following items are **INVALID** schedule adjustment requests:

- Lunch period changes
- Teacher changes
- Rearranging schedules
- Adding online courses via FVS/GAVS
- Removing online courses via FVS/GAVS
- Waiving into an Honors or AP course

Our final course verification was from April 8-12, 2024. This was the last window to request Honors, AP, and online courses. If your student missed the Dual Enrollment deadline for Fall 2024, the deadline to participate in Spring 2025 Dual Enrollment is November 1. We look forward to a fantastic new year!

PARKING

We are being TIGHT with student parking as we look to have a more secure campus. Knowing where students are to be parking is a part of that process.

Parking will be sold to **ONLY SENIORS FIRST**. The status of parking is as follows:

- Over 300 spaces have been sold between the RED and BLUE lots.
- STUDENTS WHO HAVE PURCHASED PARKING ONLINE CAN PARK ON CAMPUS ON MONDAY, AUGUST 5.
- Again, FCS provides bus transportation for ALL STUDENTS!

Other parking info:

The JUNIOR PARKING LOTTERY process will begin on **Wednesday, August 7 and Thursday, August 8. All JUNIORS will be sent an email AFTER the first day of school letting them know the process for entering the lottery.**

The following infractions will get a student vehicle towed IMMEDIATELY:

- Parking in the VISITOR SECTIONS
- Parking on the curb in the parking lot
- Any vehicle NOT registered in the system

ANY STUDENT parking on campus without a permit MAY HAVE THEIR VEHICLE TOWED! (This is your warning – DO NOT PARK WITHOUT A PERMIT).

ONLINE CLASSES

Milton High School's policy regarding ONLINE CLASSES was shared during the registration process for the 24- 25 school year. As a reminder, the MHS policy is as follows:

- Students are only allowed to take an online class during period 1, 2, 6, & 7.
- Students taking online classes **are not allowed** to be on campus during their online class periods.
- Online students must report to school on time for their scheduled face to face classes.

FCS CELL PHONE/PERSONAL COMMUNICATION DEVICE (PCD) POLICY

In grades 6 through 12, the use of PCDs is **not allowed during instructional time** and will only be allowed when explicitly instructed to do so by a teacher or other school staff member.

The use of cell phones and other PCDs for non-educational purposes, including but not limited to, recording staff and/or students without permission or other inappropriate content is strictly prohibited. Discipline consequences will be given.



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BELL SCHEDULE

We have modified our bell schedule for the 24-25 school year. We will no longer have a stand-alone ADVISEMENT PERIOD. Instead, on TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY, and THURSDAY, students will have an extended SECOND PERIOD. The extra time during that period will allow the classroom teacher to better serve the students during that advisement time. On Mondays and Fridays, all periods will be equally distributed across the seven (7) class periods. **These schedules are represented as “A” (Monday & Friday) and “B” (Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday).**

FIRST WEEK SCHEDULE

During the first week of school (August 5 – 9) we will be using a “HOMEROOM SCHEDULE”. The “HOMEROOM SCHEDULE” (**C SCHEDULE**) allows us to have our grade level meetings during that first week of school. There may be some other instances when we will use this schedule during the school year.

ATTENTION ALL JUNIORS

MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE REQUIREMENT Effective July 1, 2021, children 16 years of age and older, who are entering the 11th grade (including new entrants), must have received one booster dose of the meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4), **unless their initial dose was administered on or after their 16th birthday.**

STUDENT DRESS GUIDELINES (DRESS CODE)

While we understand that fashion trends come and go, we must have standards that promote the health and safety of ALL Milton High School students. Student attire should not interfere with the educational process.

The following items are prohibited:

- Articles of clothing or materials advertising gangs, alcoholic beverages, drugs, and tobacco, obscene, vulgar, suggestive, pornographic, violent language or pictures
- Clothing exposing undergarments
- Sagging Pants
- Hoodies overhead

We kindly urge you to have open discussions with your children about the importance of making responsible clothing choices and the significance of portraying oneself in a positive light. Encouraging them to opt for attire that promotes respect, individuality, and inclusivity will not only foster a safer school environment but also help them develop into conscientious members of society.

Consequences for dress guideline violations may result in a discipline referral to the grade level administrator.
