



Open Primary Elections in Fairfax County and City, Tuesday, June 11, 2019

**All registered voters in Fairfax County and City may vote in this primary.
 All precincts will be open because the Commonwealth’s Attorney and
 Chairman of the Board of Supervisors are county-wide.**

- Only the **Democratic** Party will have candidates in this primary.
- The **Republicans** and **Libertarians** are not holding primaries to select their candidates this year; they have nomination meetings, sometimes called caucuses or firehouses.
- **Independent** candidates have until June 11, 2019, to file for the election in November.
- **School Board** members run with no party affiliation.
