Local Congregational Focus:

Mission Projects at Trinity Presbyterian

This year Trinity has been busy! We are currently sponsoring two refugee families through the International Institute of Southwest Missouri, which "provides opportunities for immigrants and refugees to thrive". Unfortunately they lost their nonprofit funding in January so the committee that serves as their community support liaison has been working overtime!

Members have been regularly providing meals for women at Safe to Sleep and for a veterans group. Volunteers have been working hard to update Trinity House at Eden Village for a new occupant.

We have monthly Crosslines food/supplies drive with regular volunteers and donations. Our Lydia Circle supports the "Wish I May" ministry by donating to help families celebrate birthdays.

We have recently trained leaders for the John Calvin Living Waters of the World ministry as well as participants and general support for the program.

Our Knitting4Peace group has been keeping our items here in Springfield this year rather than sending them off to refugees elsewhere. Some of our refugees arrived here in mid winter without any items to keep them warm so we were happy to supply them and any other refugee family in need with scarves, hats and mittens.

After the hurricanes in the Southeast we joined other PW groups in the presbytery preparing buckets for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.

Our PW brunches in the summer and December have collected hygiene items for Care To Learn. We also sponsor the Mr. Rogers Sweater Drive in November.

We are thankful for our dedicated volunteers who lovingly care for others in so many ways!

Campfire Banana Splits by DeDe Vest

Ingredients

2 cups semisweet chocolate chips

I (10.5 ounce) package miniature marshmallows

<u>Directions</u>

Preheat the grill for high heat.

Spray 4 sheets of aluminum foil, large enough to wrap bananas, with cooking spray.

Slice the peel of the banana from stem to bottom, while slicing the banana inside lengthwise. The bananas can be cut into slices instead if you like, (while still in the peel) for easier handling later.

Carefully open the banana just wide enough to place the chocolate chips and marshmallows inside the peel with the banana. Stuff with as much of the chocolate chips and marshmallows as desired.

Wrap the bananas with the aluminum foil and place on the grill or directly in the coals of a fire. Leave in long enough to melt the chips and the marshmallows, about 5 minutes. Unwrap bananas, open the peels wide, and eat with a spoon.

(if you have vanilla or strawberry ice cream, it's great with a scoop on top!)



We had several JCP PW in attendance at the Synod PW meeting in Prairie Village, KS on August 2nd. There were three main workshops, which were all excellent.

There were 73 attendees including Ken Tilus with Presbyterian Children's Home and Services, PW Churchwide Moderator Pam Snyder, Moderator of Synod of Mid-America Presbyterian Women Mary Jorgensen and Synod Representative to PW Coordinating Team Mary Hoskins. All six Presbyteries were represented at this gathering.

First we heard from Susan Jackson -Dowd, the Executive Director of PW. She gave an overview of the 2025-2026 Bible Study. She is the final editor of the bible study and is part of the 4 year process of creating these. Not only that, but she has extensive history with

PW and her brain is an archive of PW activity through the years. I'm excited to start "Finding Resilience, Joy and Our Identity in Jesus Christ". This years bible study is beautifully written, beautifully put together, and will give us a lot to think about and a lot to discuss.

Next, the PW Churchwide Moderator, Pam Snyder, gave a presentation on the United Nations
Commission on the Status of
Women. She has been involved
with the UNCSW for 18 years.
The presentation was informative
and inspirational. At the same
time, it was disappointing. As Pam
said, the UNCSW began in 2008
and it seems like the steps forward are small and slow. Pam
would be a great speaker at any
PW Gathering!

Last, but not least, our very own Toni Spieth and Tara Napoleone-

Clifford gave a presentation on RED Team, representing the Mid-America Synod. RED is PW Racial Equality Dialogue group, and is tasked with supporting the Matthew 25 Initiative by "building an inclusive, caring community" that "works for justice and peace" through dialogue as a tool for building relationships among and between women from different racial/ ethnic groups and background. The presentation was informative and humorous. Good job Toni!

A short business meeting was held which revealed plans for a 2026 Synod Gathering, possibly in Branson. Presbyterian Women from JCP will be involved in coordinating details for this event. Information coming in a couple months.

Current Issue of Horizons Magazine


