



2017 NQF Innovation Challenge Award Presentation

Health care quality is increasingly being measured to better inform patient decision-making. However, quality performance measures may be evidence-based, but lack meaningful patient input.

To address this concern, PQA's Patient & Caregiver Advisory Panel voiced the need for a rubric that can be used by measure developers and the patient community to better incorporate and assess meaningful patient engagement throughout quality measure development.

In 2017, PQA and the National Health Council (NHC) submitted this idea to the "National Quality Forum Innovation Challenge." Our submission was one of five winners selected, recognizing that a patient-engagement rubric for measure development is a need and an innovative approach for improving patient-centered health care measurement.

On Thursday, March 1, 2018 from 1:00 – 2:00 pm ET, Dr. Matthew K. Pickering of PQA and Dr. Eleanor M. Perfetto of NHC will share this proposed rubric idea to assess the patient-centeredness of measure development.
