

TONISHA JOHNSON Journalist, Spectrum News 1 Ohio

Tonisha Johnson is an Emmy Award-Winning Multimedia Journalist for Spectrum News 1 Ohio, covering politics and education across the state.

Whether it's in the classroom or the statehouse, she delves into legislation and shares the stories of those impacted in rural, urban and suburban communities. She also shines a light on teachers, students, districts and legislators making their mark in education.

Since being a part of the Spectrum News 1 team, she's produced and hosted virtual education town halls in addition to the documentary Glass Walls: Black Experiences in Higher Education. The documentary addresses students and their experiences with systemic racism. Currently, she serves as the co-chair for the station's Local Fairness Group, which brings employees together to address issues of diversity, equity and inclusion within the newsroom and in relationship to the content that goes on air.

Johnson is a native of Springfield, Illinois, and earned a degree in Mass Communications (minoring in Spanish) from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. She also holds a Master of Divinity degree from Hood Theological Seminary.

Before joining Spectrum News 1, Tonisha was a reporter for WTVI (PBS) in Charlotte, and WRCB-TV, in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

When she is not covering news, she enjoys traveling with her family, designing clothes, and mentoring youth and young adults. You can also find her connecting with others locally and internationally on mission trips.

JOHN COMERFORD, Ph. D., President Otterbein University

Dr. John Comerford joined Otterbein University as the president in 2018 with a record of commitment and advocacy for higher education and liberal arts colleges.

Believing that higher education is the "great equalizer," he has focused on access and

affordability. He helped established a scholarship that covers full tuition for Ohio students from families of financial need. The Dual Admission Program, a partnership with Columbus State Community College, provides one of the most affordable degree programs in the state of Ohio. Now enrolling the most diverse classes in University history, Otterbein's first-year class has grown from 12% to 27% students of color.

To build the student pipeline and workforce of the future, the university is partnering with area companies, Columbus State Community College and Columbus City Schools. His work in creating the Otterbein Advantage Partnership provides expanded experiential learning and internship opportunities for students and brings industry experts into Otterbein classrooms and labs while also providing partnering company employees, their spouses/partners, and dependent children a scholarship that makes a private university education available for the cost of a public university.

The native of Kenosha, Wisconsin, Comerford completed his doctorate degree in higher education administration with an emphasis in law at the University of Kansas. He also holds a master's degree in college student personnel administration from the University of Central Missouri and a bachelor's degree in political science from Western Illinois University. He has conducted research in areas from higher education law to college student culture.
