To be a little braver, a little kinder, a little more compassionate - with ourselves, with each other, and with the young people we serve. Because when we keep hope alive, lives change. Thank you for being the heart of Valley Youth House.

SHINING A SPOTLIGHT ON 30 YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE



LINDA ROLLEY

Linda's journey with Valley Youth House began on a chilly March morning in Allentown, when she walked into the agency as a brand-new Case Manager. Fresh out of college and surrounded by seasoned professionals, she initially held back, unsure of her voice. But with the encouragement of her colleagues, she grew into a passionate advocate for young people. Over the years, she earned her Master's in Community Counseling, adapted to the ever-changing landscape of social services, and took on leadership roles in programs like Family Based Mental Health, Independent Living, and Adolescents Achieving Independence. She played a key role in expanding services, helping Valley Youth House become a SWAN affiliate, and creating spaces for youth to safely share their experiences.

Now, as the Director of Permanency and Independent Living Services, Linda continues to shape the future of youth advocacy. She has helped develop statewide policies, guided new staff, and built lasting traditions like the annual Independent Living Thanksgiving dinner. Her commitment has influenced generations of youth, many of whom have gone on to work at the agency themselves. Even after 30 years, her passion for supporting young people remains steadfast. We are deeply grateful for her leadership, dedication, and the lasting impact she has made at Valley Youth House.

SILVIA CUSTIS-HENRY

Thirty years ago, Silvia Custis-Henry was new to the Lehigh Valley, unsure where her career would take her. After completing clerical courses at the Private Industry Council (now known as Career Link), she found herself at Valley Youth House—though she often says Valley Youth House found her. What began as a part-time administrative role quickly opened her eyes to the struggles young people face when experiencing homelessness. Witnessing their hardships was difficult, but instead of looking away, she embraced the opportunity to be part of an organization working to provide safety, support, and hope.

Over the years, Silvia's role evolved, but her commitment to Valley Youth House never wavered. She handled everything from processing checks and managing the Holiday Gift Drive to assisting with case notes, always stepping in where help was needed. When the chance came to join the Talent Acquisition team, she took a leap and found fulfillment in connecting with new hires drawn to the agency's mission. Looking back, she wishes she had been more confident in her early years, but one thing has always been clear—Valley Youth House goes above and beyond for young people, and she's proud to be part of that work.



BREAKING THE CYCLE FOR A BETTER FUTURE

After spending years in the system, moving through different placements, and facing legal troubles, Spencer made a choice. He wanted more for himself and his future. Since his case manager began working with him in March 2024, she's watched him take incredible steps forward. He found a job, secured his own apartment, and even bought a car.

But what stands out most about Spencer is his drive. He's not just doing this for himself—he's also a dad, and he wants to build something stable for his child. He's worked hard to leave his past behind and stay focused on his goals, and that's not always easy. Watching him grow over these past months has been inspiring, and his team couldn't be prouder of how far he's come. With his determination, Valley Youth House is certain he's going to keep pushing himself forward long after graduating from our Dauphin & Perry County Transitional Living Program (TLP).



ARYZA AND PRESTON'S JOURNEY HOME

For Aryza and Preston, the journey to stable housing was anything but easy. With four children to care for, they spent months living in a tent, navigating the uncertainty of each day. As winter approached, the need for a permanent home became even more urgent.

In December 2024, everything changed. Through Valley Youth House's York County Rapid ReHousing Program (RRH), they secured a house approved for a Section 8 voucher. The moment they received the keys is one Aryza and Preston will never forget. The simple act of opening the door to their own space felt almost surreal. Their new three-bedroom house wasn't just a roof over their heads; it was the foundation for a future they had worked so hard to build.

"It was a long process, but being part of the Valley Youth House Rapid ReHousing Program has completely changed our lives," Preston said. Aryza echoed his sentiment, adding, "After connecting with Valley Youth House, we were able to receive the assistance that helped us get a big house for our kids."

Today, their home is filled with the sounds of laughter echoing down the hallways, the clatter of dinner being prepared, the comfort of knowing that at the end of the day, they have a place to rest. The Valley Youth House Rapid Re-housing Program is proud to have been part of their journey and wishes them nothing but success as they continue building their future.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony for our new space was a true reflection of what Valley Youth House is all about. Staff, supporters, and community partners gathered to celebrate not just a new office, but a deeper commitment to ensuring that every young person has the support they need to thrive.

We're grateful to everyone who helped make this space a reality and excited for what lies ahead as we continue our work in Philadelphia - now with a new home base and two decades of impact behind us.

This 43-acre property, formerly known as Camp Horseshoe, was originally built in 1944. In 2004, Valley Youth House purchased the property from the Boys and Girls Club of Allentown. In 2006, Valley Youth House renamed the property Camp Fowler after Beall and Lenny Fowler generously contributed the lead gift to **The Campaign for Camp Fowler**. By 2009, **The Campaign for Camp Fowler** raised \$7.5 million dollars from generous community supporters, enabling Valley Youth House to build the ADA-accessible Fleming Pool and Patio, a shower house, an adventure ropes course, rock climbing wall and zip line, renovate the central dining hall, and make overall improvements. The remaining funds were placed in an endowment fund helping to ensure the operation and programming of Camp Fowler.

In 2019, with the help of Rick Kaze of Kay Builders, Inc., Eric Scheler of Watson Land Company, Richard Brooks of Brooks Development Group, and Anthony Raso of Majestic Realty Co. and Commerce Construction, Valley Youth House launched the **Camp Fowler Cabin Construction Campaign**. Through the generosity of many companies and community supporters, Valley Youth House completed the \$2.4 million dollar project to rebuild the seven cabins that house youth and staff attending camp. The current cabins have improved amenities including heating, air conditioning, indoor plumbing, fire protection and sprinklers, and ADA-accessibility.

Chuck and Cindy Yeoman provided funding to build the Archery Range on the far corner of the camp's property. This program is an exciting opportunity for youth to learn a new skill. A year later, The Helen & R.K. Laros Foundation provided additional funding for the Archery Range, in honor of Laura Bennett, an award-winning archer. Over the years, IronPigs Charities presented by Air Products have funded programs that help campers build confidence and perseverance through immersive outdoor play. Their support has brought a hilltop ropes course and dynamic low-element adventure course, renovations to the basketball courts, as well as a mobile skate park, complete with boards and safety equipment, to life.
