Ruth Santana-Grace. I am pleased with the results and look forward to serving under their leadership for the next two years.

The coming days and weeks will be filled with folks doing the business of the church. Regular worship experiences remind us that we are first and foremost the church and all of the business and busyness is in support of doing our work as the body of Christ.
