Finding God in the Common Good

'The best Lesson I learned at Sounion, Greece? To look young and slim, stand by something really big and old'

Carol came to Mississippi University for Women on a scholarship which to her was a blessing because she loves Mississippi. Some years later a friend introduced her to the Episcopal Church and she 'fell in love' with the church. She has been writing daily devotional pieces since August of 2000, and a compilation of them was published in a book called Holy Ordinary. A second meditation book called Practically Holy appeared in the fall of 2008. Both are available through the 'Holy Ordinary' website. She also wrote a Lenten devotional book, Disciples on the Way, for the Forward Movement, and it is available through them and through Church Publishing.

She worked for the State of Mississippi for 28 years, and retired in August of 2006 to attend seminary at Yale Divinity School in New Haven, Connecticut. In May, 2009, she completed seminary at Yale and returned to Mississippi. She was ordained to the priesthood on December 2nd, 2009. She served until December of 2013 as Episcopal chaplain to Mississippi State University, and as assisting priest at the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection in Starkville, Mississippi. She now serves as priest-incharge at St. Peter's by-the-Lake Episcopal Church in Brandon, Mississippi, the place where her deep encounter with God began.
