Church School and Child Care Schedule:


- Childcare for infants through preschool is provided for the whole service, also in the East Wing. There is a paging system for parents to stay connected.

Dmitri Bortniansky was born in the city of Glukhov, Russian Empire (in present-day Ukraine). His father was an Orthodox religious refugee. At the age of seven, Dmitri's prodigious talent at the local church choir afforded him the opportunity to go the capital of the empire and sing with the Imperial Chapel Choir in St. Petersburg, where he studied music and composition under the Choir's director. Bortniansky gained considerable success composing operas; he also composed sacred works in Latin and German, both a cappella and with orchestral accompaniment. Often called the "Russian Palestrina", he is best known today for his liturgical works and his prolific contributions to the genre of choral concertos. In 1882, Tchaikovsky edited the liturgical works of Bortniansky, which were published in ten volumes. While Bortniansky wrote operas and instrumental compositions, it is his sacred choral works that are performed most often today. This vast body of work remains central not only to understanding 18th-century Orthodox sacred music, but also served as inspiration to his fellow Ukrainian composers in the 19th century.
