Opening for Full Time Firefighter/AEMT

The Sanbornton Fire & Rescue is accepting applications to fill an open position of full time Firefighter/AEMT (Paramedic preferred).

Sanbornton Fire & Rescue is a combination department made up of a full time Chief, a part time Deputy Chief/EMS Coordinator, 1 full time Lieutenant/EMS provider, 1 full time Firefighter/EMS provider, 15 On-Call Firefighters and EMS providers and 7 Per Diem Firefighter/EMS providers.

The full time Lieutenant and Firefighter/AEMT work rotating 12-hour shifts (3 on w/3 off) from 7 am to 7 pm and are also required to be “on call” 1 night per week, which they receive a 2-hour paid stipend for the night coverage and overtime for any hours called out.



Minimum requirements:

- 18 years of age
- High School diploma (or GED)
- NH Licensed provider at the AEMT level
- Valid NH driver's license
- Pro-Board Firefighter II or equivalent
- Current CPAT certificate or lateral transfers of full-time career personnel pursuant to State of NH Administrative Rule 703.01

- Highly motivated individuals that can show a commitment to the town, our residents and the department.

Additional consideration will be given to applicants with:

- Paramedic certification

The Sanbornton Fire & Rescue is well respected and supported by the residents and tax payers of the Town of Sanbornton which allows us to stay up to date with apparatus and equipment. Currently the apparatus fleet consists of 2 Engines, 1 Tanker, 2 ALS transport Ambulances, 1 Forestry Unit, 1 Utility and 1 Command Car. We have a robust replacement plan for all apparatus. We are expecting the delivery of a new Engine in May of this year and working on the specifications for replacement of a forestry unit and ambulance in the next 18 months.

The Sanbornton Fire & Rescue responded to 519 emergency calls for service in 2020, and 2021 is on track to exceed that number, covering an area of 50 sq miles including three bodies of water and 8 miles of Interstate 93, we are also one of 35 communities that make up the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid which Sanbornton Fire & Rescue assists with mutual aid and automatic aid responses to those member communities.

During the day shift we staff the Central Station with one full time member and one per diem member that staff the “first due” engine or ambulance and supplemented by the on-call staff or off duty full time staff.

The men and women of the Sanbornton Fire & Rescue also make up the “Sanbornton Fire Relief Association” that participate in fund raising efforts for town charities & events.



The town of Sanbornton is located in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire in the east-central part of the state, south of the White Mountains Region and extending to the Maine border. It is named for the numerous lakes in the region, the largest of which are Lake Winnipesaukee, Lake Winnisquam, Squam Lake, and Newfound Lake. The area comprises all of Belknap County, the southern portion of Carroll County, the eastern portion of Grafton County, and the northern portions of Strafford County and Merrimack County.

Besides the lakes, there are also two small mountain ranges, the Belknap Mountains which lie to the southwest, and the Ossipee Mountains to the northeast.

The area is a popular tourist destination in the summer time, with the activity peaking during the annual Motorcycle Week and races at Loudon's New Hampshire Motor Speedway. Other tourist destinations include Funspot in Weirs Beach, the Squam Lakes Natural Science Center in Holderness, the children's museum of Center Harbor, Gunstock ski resort and Bank of New Hampshire Pavilion at Meadowbrook, both in Gilford, Castle in the Clouds in Moultonborough, and the town of Wolfeboro, which claims to be the nation's oldest resort town. Lake Winnipesaukee is the largest lake in the state.



Sanbornton is also only a 30-minute drive to the state's Capital (Concord), 1 ½ hour drive to Boston and a 2-hour drive to Portland ME.
