A Note from the Music Director:

You may have noticed in recent weeks that the organ sounds a little different. Perhaps you've noticed there's a little more bass? You may have noticed this particularly in quiet sections. Well, you are correct! I'm very pleased to announce that some renovations were completed on the organ recently and the project was a major success.

It can be a little hard to talk about the organ without getting technical, but I'll try to explain it in lay terms. There are well over a thousand pipes in our organ, and they're divided into about 25 different groups, called ranks. Each rank has a different sound, and may produce low, medium or high pitches. In our organ, there are two ranks that produce the very lowest pitches. The lowest note on these lowest ranks use a pipe that is 16 feet long, so they're called 16 foot ranks. Now usually, if an organ only has two 16 foot ranks, they're designed so that one of them is loud and one of them is soft. This is so that you can have a nice full bass sound no matter how loud the music you're playing is. That was not so with our organ. Both 16 foot ranks were pretty loud on our organ. This could make things pretty tricky when playing soft organ repertoire, or accompanying the choir or a solo singer or instrumentalist. Often, I would not use a 16 foot stop at all, unless playing a fairly loud passage of music. As a result, the lack of bass in soft music can make the music sound like it's lacking a foundation and is less full.

Thankfully, the Joining Jesus Capital Campaign raised funds for organ renovations. In August and September, the A. Thompson Allen Company worked on addressing the problem I described. They determined the best course of action was to make an alteration to one of the ranks to make it less loud. The technical term for this is revoicing. They did an excellent job, and it's so pleasing to now be able to play more softly with a nice full bass. Not only does the organ sound better, but the choir sounds fuller when accompanied now, because there is a stronger foundation. ***I want to thank everyone who donated to the Joining Jesus campaign for making this project possible.*** I hope you're all as pleased with the result as I am!

Vestry Update

The September meeting involved some final planning for the Ingathering picnic and updates on a variety of topics. Here is a summary of key updates:

- There are exciting plans for church school this fall as generous volunteers are stepping in while we begin the process of searching for a new Director of Christian Education.
- Patti Cullen is the Vestry liaison to the St. Paul's Nursery School and shared information from their recent Board meeting. We were happy to learn that the nursery school is fully enrolled.
- The workshop run by the Witness Stones Project is scheduled for November 6 at 4 p.m.
- The Financial Sustainability Task Force is continuing its work and will report to the Vestry next month.
- The Stewardship Chairs have a plan and theme for this year; the Vestry supported their request for a single service on November 20 and provided some feedback.

The Vestry also engaged in some discussion about how we can move forward thoughtfully as we determine how best to prioritize and structure our parish's ministries. We know things will not be the same as before the pandemic, and we know that we need to be mindful to not stretch our volunteers and staff too thinly. This will be an ongoing topic of discussion, and Vestry members welcome any thoughts you have. We're excited to write a new chapter together!

The Sustainable Development Fund of The Episcopal Church in Connecticut (ECCT) provides grants for projects that address the Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations [THE 17 GOALS | Sustainable Development \(un.org\)](#)

The Diocese provides the funding, but applicants must be sponsored by an ECCT parish. The vestry of St. Paul's voted to support the application of The Diocese of Mumias, Kenya to address climate change by increasing the forest cover in Mumias to 10% and reducing biodiversity loss through planting varied plant species. The project will also provide more nutrients for the local people. The application was approved by the ECCT and funds were recently forwarded to the Diocese of Mumias. The Rt. Rev. Dr. Joseph Maumo Wandera, Bishop of Mumias, will keep St. Paul's informed of project progress. Please contact the office or any member of the Christian Ed Committee with questions, ideas, or to volunteer. We look forward to seeing you very soon.

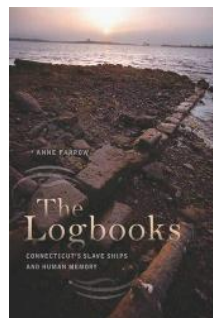

Adult Forum - The Logbooks

Adult Forum has resumed in-person meetings on Sunday mornings at 9:00 in the Common Room—all are welcome! As a complement to the upcoming Witness Stones workshop, we will be reading and discussing the book *The Logbooks: Connecticut's Slave Ships and Human Memory*, by Anne Farrow.



The website Goodreads introduces the book in this way: "In 1757, a sailing ship owned by an affluent Connecticut merchant sailed from New London to the tiny island of Bence in Sierra Leone, West Africa, to take on fresh water and slaves. On board was the owner's son, on a training voyage to learn the trade. *The Logbooks* explores that voyage, and two others documented by that young man, to unearth new realities of Connecticut's slave trade and question how we could have forgotten this part of our past so completely." As Farrow writes about the *Logbooks*, she also explores the idea of memory and loss of memory as her mother is diagnosed with dementia.

The Unity in Faith Food Drive held on September 17th was a total success for the participating churches and especially for Master's Manna. We are delighted to have been one of the ten Wallingford churches to participate. In fact, St. Paul's proudly came in second with 711 lbs of food and \$260 cash contributions for Master's Manna, in addition to collecting \$150 for diapers and a large package of toddlers' socks for the Community Day Care. The total collected by all churches was 4,608 lbs of food and \$800 cash donations. The breakdown by church is as follows:

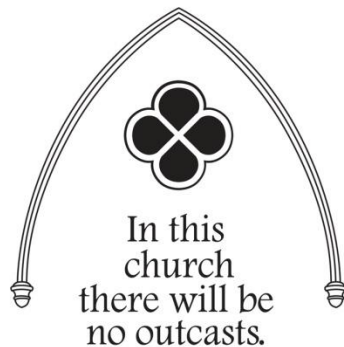
