At our November meeting, the Vestry discussed a variety of ongoing projects including Stewardship Sunday, the upcoming Holiday Stroll, and the Christmas service schedule (which you will see has been changed this year due to Christmas Eve being on a Sunday). We also voted to allocate \$300 of our advertising budget to try out Facebook ads for

our upcoming Advent and Christmas services. Hope McGrath is spearheading this effort, and we will analyze the impact after the holidays to determine if this is something we want to continue. We continued conversations about identifying priorities for allocating the Outreach money generated from Sacred Trust and will be establishing a subcommittee of Vestry members and parishioners to work on this. If you are interested in participating, please let Amy Foster know.

Regarding the search for a priest-in-charge, the Vestry has completed the Unconscious Bias training that is required before we read applications or interview candidates. In addition, the job opening has been posted not only on the ECCT website but also on two nationwide sites. Now, we pray and we wait to see who comes forward. We ask that you keep this process in your prayers as we seek to find the right person for St. Paul's!


St. Paul's will once again be partnering with Wallingford's "Holiday for Giving" to help those in need in our community have a wonderful holiday. **Our drive this year starts on Thanksgiving Weekend, November 26th, and ends on St. Nicholas Sunday, December 10th.** We will have the Christmas tree up in the back of the church and it will be decorated with "wishes" ornaments. Please take a wishes ornament and bring back an unwrapped gift to place under the tree. We ask when you take a "wishes" ornament off the tree, you hang another ornament from the box so our tree will stay decorated throughout the Christmas season reminding us of the warmth and joy we brought to others. We are asking for infant items (rattles, small stuffed animals, teething toys, clothing); toys, books, puzzles, and games for children ages 1 to 10; toddler underwear, socks and sleep pants for the Community Day Care; gift cards \$20 or under to Walmart, Subway, East Side Market, Shop Rite, Stop & Shop, and pizza, ice cream, and donut shops.

The deadline for placing gifts under the Christmas tree is Sunday December 10th. 
December is jam-packed with events for children and families at St. Paul's! Here's what's coming up this month:

HARVEST FAIR UPDATE

It was the first Saturday in seven weeks that the sun was shining – outside and inside. Our Harvest Fair kicked off at 9:00 a.m. following a week of making our famous Mile High Apple Pies. This year we made a total of 222 pies and donated 11 to Master's Manna.

After all the baskets were won, after all the burgers and hot dogs and grilled cheese sandwiches, and apple pie a la mode were eaten, after the tables were taken down and the kitchen cleaned, and the vendors packed up, we were thankful for the success of our Harvest Fair. The net proceeds raised from the Harvest Fair totaled \$4,511. 33!

The success of our Harvest Fair was made possible by the help of so many who dedicated hours of time making pies, setting up and manning St. Paul's tables, cooking and serving lunch, and cleaning up afterwards, and the fourteen vendors who brought beautiful items to sell, the Henry family who donated the apples, everyone who came down to Wilkinson Hall to help peel apples, roll dough and assemble the pies during the week before, and the many people who came through our doors to have fun and purchase items. This year's fair especially showed the unity of St. Paul's, the bringing together of everyone to help make this event a success. A special thank you to each and every one of you.

November Food & Diaper Drive UPDATE!

We had competition for the November Food Drive. The Boy Scouts were running their Thanksgiving Food Drive on the same day. But we still collected 320 lbs of food for Master's Manna, along with \$453 in cash donations -- \$373 of which was collected at Jay's concert -- and \$215 for diapers for the Community Day Care. When we drove our two SUVs into Master's Manna's driveway at 12:15, the Boy Scouts (including St. Paul's Troop 4) had already unloaded and were sorting 7,000 lbs of food. We heard later that evening that they collected 11,500 lbs. We thank everyone who supported St. Paul's and the Boy Scouts – it was truly a community endeavor.

2023 Annual Convention

The 239th Annual Convention of the Episcopal Church in Connecticut (ECCT) was held in Hartford on October 28th and 29th. Brian Sahlin and Patti Cullen attended as St. Paul's lay delegates. Eight resolutions were adopted, and several annual elections were held.

A summary follows:

- 1) Approved ECCT's \$7 million operating budget. The two main revenue sources - parish contributions of \$4.2 million (58%) and a draw from endowment funds \$2.1 million (30%) go to support a wide variety of missions and initiatives. Other revenue sources cover ECCT's administrative expenses.
- 2) Approved of a 3.05% percent cost of living increase in the clergy compensation schedule.
- 3) Adopted the amendment to Canon XVI - Bishop Transition Process which will streamline that process.
- 4) Passed a resolution Repudiating Discriminatory Legislation and Harmful Rhetoric Targeted at Transgender, Non-binary, and Gender Non-Conforming Persons. This resolution will be forwarded to the General Convention Office where it will be shared with those working on this issue.
- 5) Approved a \$20K appropriation for a historical analysis of ECCT endowments and to support congregations desiring to join in the work of Racial reparations.
- 6) Acknowledged the 175th Anniversary of the Abolition of Slavery in the state of CT and created an ECCT Reparations fund.
- 7) Voted to end the requirement for a Racial Justice Addendum to the ECCT Parochial report as it duplicated information and created an unreasonable burden on parishes to report this information twice. Instead, the parishes will use the narrative section of the parochial report to describe the Ministries of Racial Healing, Justice and Reconciliation.
- 8) Approved the merger of St. Mary's, Manchester and St. John's, Vernon. The new Parish will be called St. John's.

Annual elections filled positions for Standing Committee and Mission Council, among others. A complete list of resolutions, election results and the Bishop's Address can be found online on the ECCT website. Please reach out to Patti or Brian if you have any questions.


