At the end of January we held our Annual Meeting and had a nice turnout for our single 9:30 service, potluck brunch, and meeting. Here are some highlights:

- We are following the advice of ECCT to keep our Vestry intact for a year as we continue our search for a priest-incharge. The one exception was that we elected Kristin Liu to finish out the term for Hope McGrath who needed to step down. We appreciate all Hope has brought to the Vestry and welcome Kristin!
- We are in much better financial shape than in many years due to our decisions last year to restructure the Sacred Trust bylaws and to move to part-time clergy. We do still have a \$20,000 deficit and will continue to seek ways to increase our revenue. One way to help address the deficit is for those who have not yet pledged to do so. You can pledge online or using hard copy forms found at the church. If you have not pledged before and have questions, don't hesitate to ask us, Sharon Turlis, or any member of the Vestry.
- We read and heard reports from many ministries of the church, showing us that we continue to thrive even in this time of transition.
- We are still looking for a new chair of the Memorial Garden Committee. Rob Page is stepping down from this role and has created a helpful list of responsibilities for the chair, so if you feel called to this ministry and would like to explore it further, please talk with Rob or either of us.
- We shared that Rev. Dr. Linda Spiers has agreed to stay on as our supply priest until we welcome a priest-in-charge.
 We are incredibly grateful for all Rev. Spiers has brought and continues to bring to St. Paul's.

The February Vestry meeting was held virtually due to the snowstorm on Shrove Tuesday. We addressed a number of ongoing and new items but no votes were taken. Regarding the search for a priest-in-charge, we did have a conversation about the concept of sharing a part-time priest with another parish. This idea was raised by parishioners at the January meeting with Rev. Tim Hodapp as well as at the Annual Meeting. We are not jumping to pursue this option, but we do plan to explore further with Rev. Hodapp how such an arrangement is arrived at and what it might look like. We want to keep all options open at this point. We ask your continued prayers for St. Paul's and for the search process.

Columbus House Update

This year Columbus House has reopened the Wallingford Emergency Shelter on a limited basis, and various faith communities are stepping in to provide meals throughout the 10 weeks. St. Paul's brought and served dinner on the 12th and provided breakfast and lunch items for the following day. On February 18 we dropped off a hot lunch, and later in the day a group of parishioners cooked a cozy Sunday dinner at the shelter. Thank you to Kara Boettger for helping organize the menus and the cooking and to volunteers Shelley Cruz, Marie Mumaugh, Diane Simpson, Hope McGrath, Joseph Ransohoff, Wanda Pizzonia, Kit Hensler, and Sam Martinez who provided food and/or helped cook and serve. Thank you to the Vestry for providing financial support for this crucial ministry for our neighbors in need.

"Souper Bowl" a Success.



At the beginning of February we started our "souper bowl" collection for Master's Manna. Last year we collected 208 cans of soup and we hoped to top that number this year. Master's Manna contacted us and said their cereal shelves were bare and they were in

great need of sauce and mac and cheese. Was there anything we could do? St. Paul's once again came through. The area in back of the church and the hallway by the office was filled with boxes and bags of food. By "Souper" Bowl Sunday we collected 409 cans of soup (double what we collected last year), 48 boxes of cereal, and a vast quantity of other food items. Art Sousa, Sharon Rogalski, Chuck Maynard and Sharon Turlis helped get the food into cars and off we went to Master's Manna. The volunteers weighed us in — a total of 640 lbs of food. Thank you to everyone who was so generous.

We won't be out in the parking lot collecting food until April, but to help Master's Manna fill their shelves we will hold a special "Cereal Sunday" on March 17th. 
