Habemus Papam! We have a pope! On May 8, the Church once again echoed these timeless words from the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica as the world welcomed Pope Leo XIV. In just over two weeks, we said a heartfelt farewell to Pope Francis and now turn with hope to a new shepherd of the Church.

Who was Pope Leo XIII?

Pope Leo XIV, formerly Cardinal Robert Prevost, chose his papal name "Leo" as a tribute to Pope Leo XIII. So who was he?

Pope Leo XIII reigned from 1878 to 1903, the fourth-longest reign of any pope. He is admired for a great many reasons, especially for writing the Prayer to St. Michael – often recited for protection against evil – and 11 encyclicals on the Rosary and on Catholic social teaching.

Pope Leo XIII promoted Marian devotion – especially through recitation of the Rosary – as a powerful antidote to the devil's attacks on the Church, the family, and society. He was well aware of

the dangers posed by trends in modern thought. He foresaw many social evils that would come to pass as a result of erroneous philosophies.

He never tired of encouraging political and moral leaders to live and rule in a Christian way. As an intellectual and spiritual leader, he was able to see deeply into the reality of the world, always acutely aware of the invisible yet very real battle being waged against the soul of each person and against communities.

"The race of man, after its miserable fall from God, the Creator and the Giver of heavenly gifts, 'through the envy of the devil,' separated into two diverse and opposite parts, of which the one steadfastly contends for truth and virtue, the other of those things which are contrary to virtue and to truth. The one is the kingdom of God on earth, namely, the true Church of Jesus Christ; and those who desire from their heart to be united with it, so as to gain salvation, must of necessity serve God and His only begotten Son with their whole mind and with an entire will. The other is the kingdom of Satan, in whose possession and control are all whosoever follow the fatal example of their leader and of our first parents, those who refuse to obey the divine and eternal law, and who have many aims of their own in contempt of God, and many aims also against God...

Let us take our helper and intercessor the Virgin Mary, Mother of God, so that she, who from the moment of her conception overcame Satan may show her power over these evil sects... Let us beseech Michael, the prince of the heavenly angels, who drove out the infernal foe..."

The Order of St. Louis IX Award was established in 1975 to honor laypersons who have contributed their time and talents to the church. It is one of the most cherished awards presented in the Archdiocese of New Orleans.



THE PAPAL BULL OF INDICTION

Tradition dictates that each Jubilee is proclaimed through the publication of a Papal (or Pontifical) "Bull of Indiction." A "Bull" is an official document, generally written in Latin, bearing the seal of the Pope. In the past the seal was made of lead and bore, on the front, the image of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul, founders of the Church of Rome, and, on the back, the name of the current Pontiff. Later an ink stamp replaced the metal seal.

Each Bull is identified by its initial words. For example, Saint John Paul II proclaimed the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000 with the Bull Incarnationis Mysterium (The Mystery of the Incarnation), while Pope Francis proclaimed the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy (2015-2016) with the Bull Misericordiae vultus (The face of mercy). 


