Spring was one reason the Coordinating Team selected Isaiah 55:12 NIV as our gathering Scripture; *You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and hills will burst into song before you, and all the trees of the field will clap their hands.* Isaiah's passage conveys an image of "Joy", and the theme selected for the spring gathering.



Joy is a theme that runs through the Scriptures, did you know that joy is mentioned up to 358 times? It varies because of the numerous Bible

translations. One of the most familiar passages which references *joy* is Galatians 5:22-23 NIV; *But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law.* Paul speaks of joy as a "fruit of the spirit," an internal state of being, it's not dependent on external circumstances but a gift of God, an attitude we hold tightly to even in difficult times. Indeed "...the joy of the Lord is our strength," as it says in Nehemiah 8:10b NIV.



Christy and Teresa Bartlett from Wayne attended the business meeting and watched Terri Sherman from First Church Lincoln be installed as the Churchwide Search Moderator for the term of 2024 through 2027. Linda Burchard from Westminster added that the giving was remarkable. \$17,000 was given in gift cards to needy agencies and an additional \$20,000 in offerings.

# Help End Period Poverty by Bringing Products to Spring Gathering!

Period poverty is a pressing issue affecting countless women around the world, particularly those in marginalized communities. It refers to the lack of access to menstrual hygiene products, sanitation facilities, and education that can lead to significant health risks and social stigma. As a church community committed to compassion and service, we have a unique opportunity to address this challenge!

Period poverty is not just an issue in other counties, in the United States, nearly 1 in 4 students have struggled to afford period products and 44% of teens report stress and embarrassment due to a lack of access to period products.

In Lincoln and Lancaster County, the Lincoln Hygiene Network fills critical gaps in hygiene access, promoting health equity. They have distributed over 393,000 hygiene and personal care items throughout Lincoln-Lancaster County, uplifting thousands of individuals and families through local school districts, nonprofit programs, and organizations!

Hygiene and period products are not covered by SNAP or WIC. This lack of assistance causes people in need to turn to shelters, food pantries, and community organizations. Lack of access to basic hygiene and period products leads to poor health and forces people to make difficult decisions to choose between these essential items and other necessities such as food and housing.

**Lincoln Hygiene Network tells us these are their MOST NEEDED ITEMS listed in order of greatest need:**

1. Tampons
2. Pads
3. Liners
4. Shampoo
5. Conditioner
6. Deodorant
7. Bar Soap
8. Toothpaste and toothbrushes

# *Finding Resilience, Joy, and Our Identity in Jesus Christ*

Suggestions for Leaders by Joyce MacKichan Walker

*I*n this Bible study, we will explore resilience. This is modeled for us by several biblical characters, gospel and epistle writers, as well as Jesus. So, what exactly is resilience?

*Resilience* is the ability to spring back into shape and to adapt well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats, or stress—such as from family, relationships, health, workplace, and financial stressors. People who survive and thrive well in change are resilient.

The Bible study is also about joy. How do we find joy in a chaotic world? Christian joy may be different from how a lot of people define joy.

*Joy* is sometimes confused with happiness. For Christians, joy can occur while we are in the midst of difficult circumstances. Joy is the second fruit of the spirit, preceded by love and followed by peace. [Gal. 5:22-23] Trusting in God when we are in trying times can fill us with glorious joy and peace. We have joy in our suffering, because ultimately our joy is found in Jesus Christ.

We will also seek to rediscover our identity.

*Identity* is more than who we are or who we show ourselves to be. At its core, it points to our humanity. Our core identity is not found in our titles, our positions, our spouses, our partners, or our possessions. For Christians, our identity is found in Jesus Christ.
