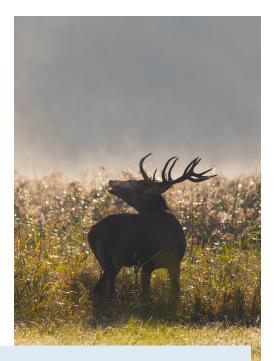

# Channels of Grace in The New Year

My family recently moved to a home that has several acres of pastureland surrounding it. We are not really a hunting family, but we have found ourselves fascinated with the deer population that we can see from our windows, especially one deer in particular. My husband has named him Walter. Some of you may be too young to remember the movie On Golden Pond, but if you know, you know! In the film, Henry Fonda spends his summers searching for the prize-winning fish named Walter. Our Walter is a sight to behold. He is at least a 10-point buck (from what we can see).

When anyone in our family thinks they see this massive creature they let it be known throughout the house. Is it him? Is it him? We all rush towards the windows to make certain, and then venture into the yard to try and get a closer look. Good Neighbor Ministries is devoted to sharing God's love with persons in immediate need in Rome and Floyd County. They provide assistance with rent and utilities, furniture purchases, funds for work uniforms, and more. You can help by volunteering your time to help where needed.

Haven Health has been serving Rome/Floyd County since 1986. They provide free pregnancy tests, abortion alternative counseling, ultrasounds, maternity and baby supplies, and more. You can help by volunteering, spreading the word about their services, and/or donating.

The Davies Shelters provide those experiencing homelessness with a bed to sleep in and support in developing the tools and skills to overcome their homelessness. You can help by volunteering your time, providing a meal, or visiting the Farm Bus.

The Exchange Club Family Resource Center works to prevent child abuse and help families grow stronger. They provide transformative in-home education and support to Floyd County families, empowering them to create safe, stable and nurturing homes to that their children can grow and thrive. You can help by volunteering at any of their events, donating money or supplies, or shopping through smile.amazon.com.

The Salvation Army meets human needs in God's name without discrimination. You can help by providing or serving a cooked meal (or after-dinner ice cream social!), sorting and hanging clothing at their thrift store, or handing out water in town where folks are gathered during the warmer months.

Hospitality House ends the cycle of intimate partner violence through prevention, shelter, and individualized services to protect and empower survivors. You can help by volunteering at their thrift store or donating needed supplies.

**ESP** Rome is a nonprofit with a mission to create transformative experiences for people with disabilities and their families. Java Joy is part of ESP! You can help by booking Java Joy, donating money, or volunteering for summer camp or after school help.

Northwest GA Hunger Ministries provides food for 200 families per week in their food pantry, as well as nutritious food for cancer patients, sack lunches for 1600 local kids per week (Backpack Buddies), and supplying 13 other community food pantries.
