Approximately 180 children and their families attended the luau where they enjoyed a fun evening of food, games, dancing and a raffle. The proceeds from this successful event went to two local missions of the United Methodist Women, Lawton's Angels Backpack Program and Seminole Families in Need.

Ladies from the First United Methodist Church of Oviedo Mary Martha Circle collected food for a United Methodist Women mission near and dear to their hearts, a backpack program called Lawton's Angels. This program provides food, school supplies and clothing for Lawton Elementary School



(Oviedo) families in need. Every week volunteers help prepare approximately 24 backpacks with food for children to take home over the weekend.

While Seminole County is considered an affluent community, nearly half of the student population in our county's public schools qualify for free or reduced lunch. The school counselors were thrilled to receive the backpacks knowing they would be put to good use. Some even had a "Family Day" where the backpacks were met with great smiles and words of

appreciation from the children. Said Sanlando United Methodist Women Social Action Chair, Cynde Kichukoff, "Sanlando has once again opened its heart to the community and we are most grateful, as are all the students who received the backpacks. It's just another example of how we are 'turning love outward' in our community."


