
A WEEK OF FUN ART EXPERIENCES

Plans are underway for a week of educational art experiences for our Junior and Senior classes here at Saint Mark's Child Development Center! Classes will be conducted by professionals trained to enrich the hearts and minds of young people through music and art, and to deliver practical coaching in the development of life skills. We want your child to be here for the fun!



The week will include three days of Culinary Arts in hands-on "**Kids in the Kitchen**" sessions (Monday through Wednesday). Donna Jaynes, previously in charge of an Oconee County public School cafeteria and Becky Hazelwood,

previously an owner of "Candlelight Catering" in Atlanta, will conduct this three-day class. The young chefs will learn kitchen safety, how to read a recipe and measure ingredients, and bring home recipes for snacks, breakfast, and entrée items they can make at home (with supervision). They will actually prepare snacks for the first part of the week, concluding with a Taco Bar lunch for everyone on Wednesday.
