TAKE UP YOUR CROSS - THE BEGINNING OF THE NEW ECCLESIATICAL YEAR

The Italians have a custom that on New Year's Eve as midnight approaches, the streets clear. There is no traffic; there are no pedestrians; even the police take cover. Then at the stroke of midnight, the windows of the houses fly open. To the sound of laughter, music and fireworks, each member of the family pitches out old dishes and plates, detested ornaments, hated furniture and any personal possession which remind them of something in the past year they are determined to wipe out of their minds.

September 1st, marks the beginning of the Ecclesiastical (Church) Year for Orthodox Christians. The month of September is an invitation to lay aside everything that hinders spiritual growth and to embrace the Cross.

"Then Jesus told His disciples, 'If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it. For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul??" (Matthew 16:24-26).



It is crucial for each of us to identify the meaning of taking up one's cross. At the time of Christ, a cross was an instrument of execution. The hangman gallows of the old west, the guillotine of medieval times and the cross were employed to take the life away from an individual. Christ however, makes this instrument of death into a weapon for life. A symbol of defeat into a symbol of victory. In Matthew 16:24-26, Jesus states the central paradox of the Christian faith. In grasping the temporal, we lose the eternal; in sacrificing everything we can know, we gain unimaginable riches. In dying, we live.

On the Cross Christ destroys the power of death. Death can no longer hold us captive, its' power has been taken away. The moment Christ died on the Cross, Hades was filled with the presence of God and could not endure the Light. After the death of Christ upon the Cross-suffering has been given new meaning. It now becomes the Way to Life in Christ.

In the light of the Cross, every thought in our heart, every word of malicious gossip and all the slanderous tales told are signs of the failure to take up one's cross. The presence of divisiveness means the power of hell is reigning and sustained through our recklessness and indifference to the Cross. There is no greater sin than that which seeks to divide the Church - there is no justification for such behavior.

Through the daily practicing of repentance the pain of our own sins begins to be felt. The first step in healing of the soul is acknowledgment of sin. A doctor cannot prescribe the proper medicine until the nature of the illness is determined. It is a "cross" to know one's self - to come face to face with the weakness and infirmities of our soul. Taking up one's cross inevitably leads to spiritual warfare.

Once sins are acknowledged the devil embarks upon a full-scale war to knock us down. Spiritual warfare is the struggle against sin. It involves prayer, fasting, the reception of Holy Communion and the intercession of the saints. In the spiritual warfare God sends legions of angels and the gift of the His Grace to strengthen us in battle. We are not left alone. The Cross becomes our companion and gives us strength to resist temptations and leads us to discipleship and the following of Christ.

Discipleship means the following of Christ. Christ can only be followed through obedience to God's will. Once engaged in spiritual warfare the paths to service of God and our neighbors become possible. Discipleship gives birth to evangelism. Those who are being led by Christ are then called upon to lead others in the Way.

The last liturgical "theme" of the year is that of being created as "Temples of God." The Virgin Mary was the first living temple of God and opens the way for all of us to become the dwelling place of Christ. The first liturgical theme of the New Church year is that of discipleship. A temple of the crucified Christ becomes a disciple of the crucified Christ.

May this New Ecclesiastical Year begin with the opening of the windows of our souls and the discarding at the feet of Christ everything that should be wiped from our memories. Putting everything away that hinders the presence of Christ and embracing all that feeds the soul shall lead to communion with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. \$\Psi Fr. Ted

AT SUMMER'S END

September marks the beginning of the new Church year as well as a new school year. It is a time when parents fulfill their religious obligations by registering their children for Sunday School and other church related activities, while making certain that their children attend faithfully each Sunday.

It is also the time parents leave behind the lazy summer months to come to church together with their children. In this respect parents have a greater role to play in the spiritual upbringing of their children, for a child learns through imitation.

Unfortunately some parents neglect their moral and Christian duty by preferring sleep rather than to attend church on Sunday. Other parents taxi their children to church, go out for coffee, and return at the conclusion of classes and church services. Many parents think that an hour or two is too long, so they substitute a six column newspaper, a TV show, or an activity in place of attending worship services on Sunday morning. These actions definitely set a bad example for the youngsters and create quite a disturbing impact upon their minds. Children know that if their parents really value church and love God that they would be attend Sunday worship. Yet, if parents consistently neglect to attend God's service, it is giving eloquent testimony that God doesn't matter and that they are not recommending Him to their children. If we are members of the official family of the Church and seldom attend its services, what better way can we have of telling our family and the world that it really doesn't make a difference.

How many of you who seldom go to church would like to live in a world where there is no God? How many parents have admitted to themselves that if they had come to church as a family they would not be having headaches over the grown children? It is unfortunate that parents realize the potentiality of the Church too late. Instead they must suffer the consequences and worse yet the children are made to suffer through the negligence of their parents.

Parents! You have a duty towards your children. They look to you for their moral and religious upbringing. Do not fail them lest they suffer the sins of their parents. Come to church as a family. Attend weekly worship services regularly. Get involved in the various ministries and activities of your parish. What greater legacy can you leave your children than for them to have a loving and personal relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ?

A week contains 168 hours. Dedicate one or two of those hours to the Lord. Your church is the place to find God, His hope, His peace, His love and His gift of salvation. Come on in! Your children will be glad you did and so will you.

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
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SPIRITUAL FUTURE

THE CALLENGE OF LEADERSHIP

Our Cathedral of Ss. Constantine and Helen is a beautiful parish complex, which everyone sees. From afar everything looks great. However, upon closer inspection we see the flaws, the wear and tear and breakdowns that have befallen our buildings and grounds, the maintenance and renovations that need to be done to keep our parish functional as to meet the needs of our membership and to keep it a strong beacon of light for Christ.

Back in January we wrote in the Message that the focus for 2019 of our church would be two fold. First and foremost would be the spiritual edification of our parishioners. This we have and are accomplishing through our religious programs, through worship, ongoing religious education and outreach ministries.

Second was to continue to renovate, refurbish and build up our physical church edifice and grounds so that our house of worship may truly be a place we can be proud of as we glorify and praise God. This aspect has proved more challenging.

Thanks be to a major donor and a few faithful parishioners we were able to renovate the Hellenic Cultural Center (Great Hall, Gold Room and Lobby) at no expense to the church. However, the Cathedral Dome Repair and Roof Renovation Project has come to a crossroad. After a successful start to fund raising half the money needed, the project was put on hold by our contractor for reasons still not understood. This is a costly delay, not only financially, but also causing more water damage to the exterior dome, Cathedral and Chapel exterior roofs and interior ceilings, as well as to the iconography of both the Cathedral and Chapel.

The Parish Council is working with our contractor to move ahead with the Cathedral Dome Repair and Roof Renovation Project as soon as possible. Shortly, the Parish Council will be presenting a special fundraising drive to our entire membership to raise not only the remaining funds for this project, but for other ones that we are facing that are turning critical. This is the challenge that not only our leadership faces, but our entire community. For as a community we worship together and should take care of our parish together.
