The Way of the Cross is a devotion to Christ's Passion that recounts the events from Jesus' condemnation to His burial, mirroring the early Christian pilgrimages to the Holy Land. This practice originated in the fifth century in Bologna and gained popularity through the Franciscans in the fifteenth century. It typically includes fourteen stations, illustrating significant moments such as Jesus' denial, falls, and crucifixion. The service features prayers and readings for each station, concluding with prayers at the altar. This devotion is particularly observed on Fridays during Lent.
