1 Corinthians 16:4

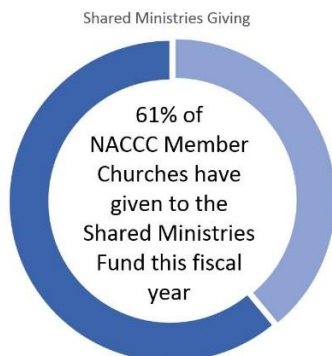
