Prayers: Ongoing flood control project at their central office.

- ◆ We are praying to find creative ways to recruit team members for the 2021 season since our typical ways are not possible.

Needs:

- ◆ 2 Nest Cameras (security) to have in our office.
- ◆ Sending a care package to one of our 8 winter teams
- ◆ Fuel gift cards to send to our team members who have to travel for their worship services and ministry

Happy Life Children's Home, Kenya

Prayers:

- ◆ Thanking God for protection of our children and staff throughout the pandemic season.
- ◆ We need God's protection for our mission and especially the schools. We have opened schools after 9 and 1/2 months and are trying to cope with the new normal.
- ◆ For the children's health and well-being.
- ◆ For provision of food, school uniform, books, and tuition fees for our children at Happy Life and those from the community - most parents are struggling after job losses.
- ◆ For God's favor upon our schools within the community.
- ◆ For our candidate class to get ready for the final exam in March.

Needs:

- ◆ School books and stationery
- ◆ School uniforms
- ◆ Funds to complete the Phase One of our high school
- ◆ Funds to equip the high school - furniture, computers, etc.
- ◆ Food and supplies for the schools and the rescue centers.
- ◆ Funds to equip our Jesse Kay Satellite clinic.

Congregational Church of Myanmar

Prayers: Provision of Okkan Mission House and Yangon Grace children dining hall.

Needs:

- ◆ Child sponsorships for 45 children.
- ◆ Provisions for rural mission workers, pastors, and families.
- ◆ Rice for mission families.

ECHO, Florida

Prayers:

- ◆ Tensions, due to terrorism and political instability, are running high all across West Africa. Please pray for our West Africa Team, based in Burkina Faso, that God will grant them wisdom to provide training in Burkina and throughout the Region as borders begin to re-open.
- ◆ Continued prayer for God's grace within the ECHO-Florida Team as we implement our new Masters Level Certificate elements into our long-standing Intern Training Program.
- ◆ Continued protection for ECHO's global teams as we are receiving, and seeking to respond to, increasing requests for training and assistance that entail increased staff exposure during this pandemic.
- ◆ Prayers for our Board of Directors as they continue to carry out their governance of ECHO's global work through virtual means during this pandemic.
- ◆ For the more than 683 men and women, from 70 countries, who participated in our Virtual International Agriculture Conference on November 19th. We pray that they will be blessed and encouraged, and God will be glorified, as they take the new knowledge and insights they gained and apply them to benefit the people they serve.

Needs:

- ◆ Continuing to raise financial support to distribute seeds around the world and provide hands-on rural trainings throughout Africa and Asia. We have ongoing needs to cover the financial costs ECHO embraces to train young people who have a heart to serve on the mission field through our internship program.

John Richard Memorial Endowment

The John Richard Memorial Endowment was established by his family as a loving and living memorial. His love for music and theater performance was a large part of his talented but short life.

About:

- The Endowment awards annual grants to National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC) Active Member Churches of 200 members or less that are planning a fine or performing arts event in their church.
- Grants will be awarded up to \$500 per church.
- All funds awarded for an event must be used by April 1, 2022.

Requirements:

1. The event program or bulletin must include mention of the John Richard Memorial Endowment of the Congregational Foundation and the NACCC. A copy of this program or bulletin must be submitted with the final grant report.
2. The church must have 200 members or less.
3. Grant recipients must complete and submit a brief questionnaire as a final grant report within 30 days of the event for which the funds were received

Church Fair Share Giving

Why Contribute?

- As an organization, our vitality is directly tied to the support our member churches provide. The NACCC exists to serve our churches and relies on financial contributions to carry out our various programs and services.
- While every congregation is unique, we strive to be valuable and relevant to all our member churches, regardless of size and needs of the church.
- Whether you see value in being a part of a national organization, utilize our networking opportunities, take advantage of our leadership resources, or rely on us to find a pastor, we ask you to contribute your Fair Share to ensure we are able to help all of our congregations for years to come.

What is Fair Share?

- The NACCC requires each of our member churches to make an annual contribution to our Shared Ministries Fund, which directly supports our programs and services.
- FAIR SHARE refers to our suggested contribution. We do not require a membership fee, but we do expect that each church support the organization through a gift. Currently, the Fair Share we ask our churches to contribute is \$13 a member.
- Consider joining other member churches who give their "Fair Share Plus," which is a contribution of \$15 or more a member. This level of giving has a significant impact on the ability of the NACCC to help churches.

How does the NACCC support our churches?

- Pastoral Searches
 - Aiding member churches and clergy in pastoral searches through a pastoral search process
- Financial Opportunities
 - Granting funds to churches facing challenges through the Hurting Churches Fund
 - Providing professional management for church endowments through the Congregational Investment Trust (CIT)
 - Loaning funds to member churches through the Building & Loan Fund
 - Subsidizing the cost of attendance at the Annual Meeting & Conference through the Providence Fund
 - Funding fine arts programs at member churches through the Richard Fund
- Fellowship
 - Hosting the Annual Meeting & Conference

- Facilitating regional retreats
- Ministers' Convocation
- Preparing tomorrow's leaders through National Association of Pilgrim Fellowship (NAPF) and Heritage of Pilgrim Endeavor (HOPE) programs
- Education
 - Training lay ministers through our Lay Ministry Training Program
 - Providing seminary education and financial support through the Congregational Foundation for Theological Studies (CFTS)
 - Hosting Congregational History and Polity Seminars online and in person
 - Printing, editing and distributing the *Congregationalist Magazine*
- Vetting and Supporting Missions
 - Vet and support 27 national and international missions
 - Provide financial support to 5 national and 11 international missions
 - 100% of all donations to specific missions goes directly to the mission.
- Providing Advisors for:
 - Church growth and vitality
 - Assessing your organizational structure and practices
 - Managing conflict
 - Evaluating clergy and other church staff, lay leaders, and volunteers
 - Creating a culture of stewardship in your church
 - Strategic planning
