Fishers of Men

One facet of the ministry of ***Fishers of Men*** is carried out through Evangelistic Medical Mission Crusades. These weeklong crusades meet medical, dental, nutritional and other physical needs present in poverty-stricken regions throughout Mexico, in order to more effectively address the spiritual needs of the people. The first crusade of 2020 took place at Peace Christian Church. This was the first time for many in the area to step into a Christian church and hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It was also the first time for several new volunteers to serve on a crusade, including Mau and Kimy, two children who have joined the Fishers of Men family. Fishers of Men also works closely with local churches and missionaries to ensure the follow-up and discipleship of the new believers that have opened their hearts and prayed to receive Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

The Endowment brochure and application form will be mailed to your church later this month, or you can [visit the NACCC website today for details and an application](#).

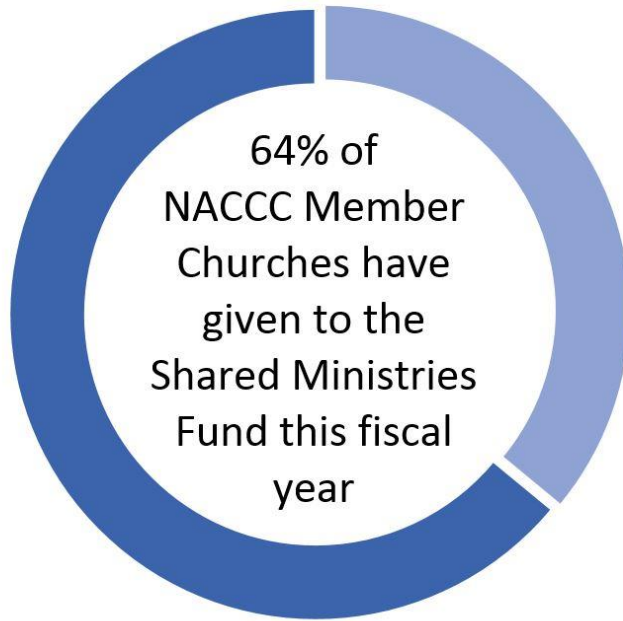

MINISTERS' CONVOCATION

Education and Fellowship

Every year, the NACCC hosts the Ministers' Convocation. This gathering for clergy is designed to provide continuing education, spiritual reflection and rest. It usually begins on the second Monday after Easter, a perfect time for clergy to renew themselves. About:

- The Providence Endowment will provide a grant to cover registration fees for the Annual Meeting and Conference.
- The registration fees provided by the Providence Endowment will be directly paid from the Endowment to the NACCC.
- Any remaining awarded funds will be sent to the church for use towards travel expenses.
- Grants will be awarded up to \$500 per church.

Requirements:

1. The Member Church must not have been able to send a delegate to the Annual Meeting for 3 or more years, due to financial reasons.
2. The Church must be an NACCC Active Member Church.
3. Grant Recipients must complete and submit a Grant Report within 30 days of the Annual Meeting and Conference for which the funds were received.

About:

- The Endowment awards annual grants to National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC) Active Member Churches of 200 members or less that are planning a fine or performing arts event in their church.
- Grants will be awarded up to \$500 per church.
- All funds awarded for an event must be used by April 1, 2021.

Requirements:

1. The event program or bulletin must include mention of the John Richard Memorial Endowment of the Congregational Foundation and the NACCC. A copy of this program or bulletin must be submitted with the final grant report.
2. The church must have 200 members or less.
3. Grant recipients must complete and submit a brief questionnaire as a final grant report within 30 days of the event for which the funds were received

- ◆ **Argentina** (Asociacion Civil Cristiana Congregacional) – child sponsorship; tools and medicine for the clinic
- ◆ **Cameroon** (Mission School of Hope) – mosquito nets, fish farm supplies
- ◆ **Colorado** (A Christian Ministry in the National Parks) – worship books, student sponsorship
- ◆ **Florida** (Bread of Life) – supplies for ministry to the homeless
- ◆ **Ghana** (Word Alive Mission) – child sponsorship and school desks
- ◆ **Haiti** (Love Worth Sharing) - bedrolls
- ◆ **Honduras** (Ministerio Vida Hospital) – medical and dental supplies
- ◆ **India** (Indian Community Fellowship) – sewing machines, food for the children, computers
- ◆ **Kenya** (Happy Life Children's Home) – sponsorships, building funds
- ◆ **Kenya** (Pilgrim's Presence) – mosquito netting, personal hygiene items for women and Bibles in Pokot Language
- ◆ **Mexico** (Fishers of Men) – supplies for medical crusades
- ◆ **Mexico** (Panamerican Institute) – student sponsorships, 30 lab coats for students (sizes 12 – 14), funding for facilities
- ◆ **Myanmar** (Congregational Church of Myanmar) – child sponsorship, support for teachers
- ◆ **Nigeria** (Christ to the Villages) – funding for Cashew Tree Farm
- ◆ **Pennsylvania** – (Hosanna Industries) – tools, building materials, classroom/activity supplies
- ◆ **Philippines** (NACC) – child support, kitchen utensils, kitchen appliances/equipment
- ◆ **Tennessee** – (Morgan Scott Project) – gas vouchers, home repair funds, books and tuition for students
