LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS - *Bread & wine are brought to the altar and the priest prepares these gifts. Be Not Afraid*

While the Cantor sings, the priest says the prayer of preparation, blessing and thanking God for the gifts of bread and wine.

STAND

Priest: Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

[The priest says a prayer over the offerings.]

Priest: The Lord be with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

[The priest continues the Eucharistic prayer.]

Response: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his holy Church.

Response: Amen.

Response: And with your spirit.

Response: We lift them up to the Lord.

Response: It is right and just.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The priest implores the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands become Christ's Body and Blood, to be consumed in Communion for the salvation of those who will partake of it.

SANCTUS – All say together

Sanctus is from the Latin, meaning "Holy."

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of
hosts, Heaven and earth are full of
your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who
comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

Please stand reverently (if your health necessitates, please feel welcome to sit).

Priest: ...Let us proclaim the mystery of faith.

MEMORIAL ACCLAMATION – All say together.

When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your death, O Lord, until you come again.

The priest continues the Eucharistic prayer.

Priest: ...Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever.

COMMUNION RITE

LORD'S PRAYER

Priest: [*Invites all to say the Lord's Prayer.*]

Response: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Priest: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Response: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever.

SIGN OF PEACE

Priest: Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles, Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever.

Response: Amen.

Priest: The Peace of the Lord be with you always.

Response: And with your spirit.

LAMB OF GOD – All say together.

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us.

PRIEST: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.



On Eagle's Wings



Adoracion, known to family and friends as Doris, was born in Bacoor, Cavite, Philippines on January 6, 1940. World War II had just begun, and her father temporarily moved his family from his hometown of Las Piñas to their mother's rice farm. Being a deeply religious man, her father named her Adoracion on the day of her birth in honor of the Feast of the Epiphany of our Lord to recall the adoration of the three magi. She passed away peacefully on September 14, in the company of her loving husband, Resty Jumaquio.

Doris was the third of eleven children born to Francisco Antonio and Felisa Herrera, a loving family of five sisters and six brothers. Being the second oldest daughter, she took care of most of her siblings at a young age. The family moved back to Las Piñas when she was a teenager and earned an accounting degree from the University of the East in Manila. She was a frequent companion of her father to social events when her father became the mayor of Las Piñas.

She worked briefly at Air Langer, but that was short-lived when she married Resty, the love of her life. She moved to the United States in 1965, residing in San Diego where Resty was stationed as a US Navy serviceman. They were blessed with three children, Rachel, Rowena and Dennis. Although Resty's Navy responsibilities had him frequently away, she raised them lovingly with her quiet inner strength. They made life-long friends in California, then moved to the Pacific Northwest in 1976 to follow Resty's Navy assignment. Bremerton (Washington) became their home until her health compelled them to move to Seattle 4 years ago.

One of Doris' greatest joys was becoming a Grandmother. She loved to take care of and spoil her 5 Grandchildren and was so happy to experience every one of their life accomplishments and milestones - birthdays, graduations, sports games, holidays.

Doris lived her life always in the service of others, never thinking about herself. Vanity was foreign to her, embodying humility and kindness instead. While in Bremerton, she worked as a food service worker in one of the dining halls on the Navy Base. After her children had grown and left home, she opened a daycare in her home, using her motherly instincts to take care of many small children.

She is now in the company of saints with her parents and siblings Teresita, Alfredo, and Viterbo, while she looks lovingly on the rest of her surviving sisters Rosalinda, Atalana, and Angelina along with her brothers Traodio, Armando, Rustico, and Ariston.

Doris is survived by her loving husband Resty, her daughters Rachel (Jason) and Rowena (Ricky), her son Dennis (Tim), and her grandchildren Taylor, Wagner, Alex, Evan, and Sofia.
