

Dear Parents,

This school year your child has been working very hard and has made lots of progress in his/her reading. We want to take the time to thank you for all of the work you have done at home to make this possible. We are very proud to work with your children, and you should be very proud as well.

We need to remind you to keep reading with your children over the summer. Many times, children will make a lot of progress during the school year, but when they don't read daily over the summer, they regress and can come back to school in August below grade level.

Our suggestion is that your child pick one book to read on their independent reading level, two books on their instructional level, and one book that would serve as a "challenge" for your child. Your Language Arts teacher will be informing you of their current reading levels on their quarter 4 report cards.

Below is a chart of leveled books that your child should be reading based on their independent reading levels. The public library also has this chart available in the children's section. The librarians are friendly and are always happy to assist with finding books of the appropriate level. Please take some time to check this out and head to the library for some summer reading fun!
