FIRST LESSON Acts 3:12-19 Read by Rebecca Ehrhardt

When Peter saw this, he addressed the people as follows:

“Why does this surprise you? Why do you stare at us as if we had made this person walk by our own power or holiness? You are Israelites, and it is the God of Sarah and Abraham, Rebecca and Isaac, Leah and Rachel and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified Jesus--the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate, after Pilate had decided to release him.
