In the silence, we confess the ways, this week, that we have done wrong—the ways we have failed to receive and to share God’s love.

One: We are harsh, and clumsy, and easily distracted. We do evil that we did not mean to do; we fail to do the good that we wish to do.

**All:** **Forgive us for our sins.**

One: We become disoriented and lose sight of that which is most important.

**All:** **Redirect us to your ways.**

One: We are caught up in systems that we did not create and cannot control.

**All:** **Empower us to bring justice.**

**Loving God, receive our confessions, bring us your peace, and restore our hope, in Jesus’ name. Amen.**

## SCRIPTURE LESSON

Jeremiah 31: 27–34 Read by Katharine Redmond

The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will sow the house of Israel and the house of Judah with the seed of humans and the seed of animals. And just as I have watched over them to pluck up and break down, to overthrow, destroy, and bring evil, so I will watch over them to build and to plant, says the LORD. In those days they shall no longer say: “The parents have eaten sour

grapes, and the children's teeth are set on edge." But all shall die for their own sins; the teeth of everyone who eats sour grapes shall be set on edge. The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah.
