SPEF ROBOTICS ACADEMY

We will use math and science skills, and develop leadership, team building, critical thinking and creative problem solving, as we work on First Lego League and Botball competition level projects. Returning students will continue to focus on programming using new sensors and cameras. This is an extended session, with Fall classes from August through January, and Spring classes February through May. Grade 6 students can select which campus they prefer to attend. Students may choose to compete in Robotics competitions. Competitions are not a requirement, however students gain additional skills and experience that may not happen in a classroom setting. Your teacher will talk more about competitions in class – if your student is interested in competitions, you are welcome to log back in to your account after registering, to pay for competitions, or you can select to for them pay now.
