How to Register

Registration For All Grades Opens On February 28, 2018, At 8 AM

Returning Families:

If you participated in SPEF Summer School 2017 or a SPEF Afterschool class in Fall 2017 or Spring 2018, you will be able to use the same account to register for Summer school 2018. When Registration opens on February 28, go to www.SPEF4kids.org and click on the link to 'Online Enrollment'. Log back in to your account, update Household, Medical information and your student's grade, and then register your student in classes. You can reset your own password.

New Families to SPEF Programs:

If you are a new family to SPEF's Programs, you are welcome to *Create your Family Account* now, and be ready when Registration opens on February 28. Go to www.SPEF4kids.org and click on the link to 'Online Enrollment'.

- Use the **'New user sign-up option'**.
- Once logged in, click on the **'Manage People and Household Information'** button at the bottom of the page to edit **Parent & Household** details and **Add** children living in the household.
- **Save your Changes**, then you are ready to go for future programs such as Summer School, Summer Camps & Afterschool.
- Once Registration opens you will be asked to confirm and save your Household information, complete Medical Information, update your student's grade, then you will be able to register your student.

General Notes:

- Students should register based on the grade level they will be entering in the Fall of 2018.
- Don't register for two classes in the same period.
- Students may not stay for brunch unless they are enrolled in both a 2nd and 3rd period class, or for lunch unless they have a class after lunch.
- You are welcome to log back in and add classes.

Students may not remain on campus during periods when they do not have a class, and they cannot remain for lunch if they do not have a class afterward, unless they are signed up to attend SPUSD Extended Daycare Summer Camp. Students cannot leave the campus to eat, such as going to HI Life, unless signed out by their parent or guardian.

Payment

Payment in full or commitment to a payment plan is expected at the time of registration. There are various payment options at check-out.

- Pay in Full by Credit Card.
- Pay by Installment using a Credit Card. By registering in a class and electing to pay by installment, you authorize SPEF to run your credit card on the dates for your chosen installment plan. The earlier you sign up, the more installment options are available to you when you check-out, as follows:

Sign up by March 9th:

Deposit + 3 installments on April 6, May 4 and June 1.

Sign up by March 23rd:

Deposit + 2 installments on April 20 and May 18.

Sign up by April 20th:

Deposit + balance on May 18.

- Deposit: The deposit per class is \$75. Deposits are non-refundable.
- Please contact the SPEF office if you need to update your credit card information between installments.
- Pay by Cash or Check: If you want to pay by cash or check, payment must be received at the SPEF Office within 48 hours of registration, or your student risks being dropped from their classes. You can select this payment option at check-out until May 31st.
- After May 31st, payment must be made in full by credit card to complete your registration. If you need to arrange an alternative method of payment after this date, please contact the SPEF Office. Your registration is not complete until you have put in place a plan to pay in full.
- Returned check or denied credit card: A service charge of \$25.00 will be assessed for a returned check or excessive follow up of a denied credit card.
- If you have any questions regarding payment, contact the SPEF office.

Cafeteria

- Meals and a la carte offerings – similar to those served during the school year – will be served between 11:25-11:55am daily.
- The cost for Intermediate students is \$3.25.
- The PIN your student has from the regular school year will work during the summer.
- If you need a PIN, contact Michelle Curry at 626-441-5820 x2950, download the Lunch form from www.SPEF4kids.org or go to www.SPUSD.net and click on the Food Services link.
- Please do not leave this to the last minute. Food Service needs to receive this application by June 1, or your student will need to use cash daily instead of a PIN.

Changes and Refunds

SPEF offers Summer School classes based on confirmed Registration. Changes to your student's registration affect SPEF scheduling and material purchase decisions. By registering in a class with SPEF, you are confirming that you have read and understand SPEF's change and refund policies.

- Refund Policy: If you need to drop your student from Summer school, a refund of all payments minus the \$75 per-class deposit will be made until May 11th. No Refunds will be given after May 11th.
- Change Policy: You can add classes to your student's schedule from your account, but you can't change your student's classes. Changes must be done by SPEF. A \$25 fee will be charged each time SPEF needs to make a change to a student's schedule. Fees arising from a schedule change must be paid at the time of the request.
- A \$25 fee will be charged for every class you need to drop because you signed your student up for multiple classes in a period.
- Requests for changes and refunds must be submitted to SPEF in writing, either by submitting the Registration Change Form, available at www.SPEF4kids.org or by emailing registration@SPEF4kids.org.
- Classes Cancelled by SPEF: In May, SPEF makes decisions about whether a class needs to be cancelled for low enrollment. If SPEF cancels a class, SPEF will contact you to help pick a new class for your student, or arrange a refund of all payments. SPEF reserves the right to cancel classes, change teacher assignments, or make other decisions pertaining to class registration and schedule, for whatever reasons deemed necessary.
- Refunds will be processed within ten working days of receipt of the Change Form or email, and issued in the original form of payment. SPEF's refund and change policy is uniformly applied. Only a parent or guardian can request a refund.
- If a student is suspended, they will be sent home for the day. If that same student is suspended a second time, they will be dismissed from the remainder of the summer program, without refund.

Full Classes

SPEF will make every effort to provide additional classes; unfortunately, it is not always possible to meet the demand for a particular class when the class becomes full. To place your student on the wait list, call the SPEF office at 626-441-5810 ext. 1163 or email the class name, period, your student's name and your phone number to registration@SPEF4kids.org.

First Day of School & Classrooms

We will email your student's classroom and teacher information at the close of business on June 14. Print this in preparation for the first day. We will also have the same information at the SPEF office on June 15 or at the school sites on the first day of school. Once you have this information, your student can go straight to their classroom without waiting in line.

On the first day of school, you are welcome to come onto campus to walk your child to class. After the first day of school, the campus will be closed for the safety of the students and staff. After the first day, parents/guardians will only be allowed on campus if volunteering in a class, and have previously arranged this with the teacher or principal. All parents/guardians must sign in at the front office before entering the campus.



Attendance

- Absences should be reported by calling the SPMS Attendance Line (626) 441-5830 ext. 1.
- There are no minimum attendance requirements for intermediate summer school classes. We do not prorate classes or camps for days absent.

Extended Daycare

SPEF does not offer extended care, but SPUSD does. Please contact the SPUSD Extended Care Office at (626) 441-5810 ext. 1125 or email extday@spusd.net to find out more.

Special Day Classes

Extended School Year, run by the SPUSD Special Education Department, is separate from SPEF Summer School. Your student's case manager will notify you if Extended School Year classes are available to your student. If you have any questions, please call (626) 441-5810 ext. 1140.

Arrival & Departure Procedures

Our priority is keeping your children safe. Please follow these Drop-Off & Pick-Up instructions:

- The two designated drop-off and pick-up areas are Oak Street and Fair Oaks Avenue inside the main parking lot along the curb.
- On Oak Street, parents are asked to drop students off on the school side of the street, to avoid students having to cross in front of oncoming traffic. Before period 1, students will be able to use the Oak Street entrance. All other times of day, students will need to proceed to the front of the school on Fair Oaks to enter the campus. The Oak Street entrance is closed at all other times during Summer School.
- On Fair Oaks Avenue, parents may enter the main parking lot through the *south* entrance to drop off and pick up. Please pull all the way forward, allow student to exit the vehicle on the right, and then exit through the *north* exit. Do not drop off on Fair Oaks Avenue.
- Parents are also asked not to park in staff parking or in designated drop-off areas, or remain parked along the curb.
- Pick-up areas are the same as for drop-off. Do not park in a driveline. Drive up, allow student to enter the vehicle, then drive out of the parking lot.
- Students must be picked up or walk home within ten minutes following the end of their last class of the day.
- Transportation is not provided for Summer School. Supervision is not provided before or after school, unless you are signed up with Extended Daycare.

Arts - Performing

<u>All Things Comedy</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 5-8) P3 (Gr. 5-8)	SANDERS
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This class is a fun introduction to the joys and thrills of improv. comedy. Students are introduced to the basics of improv. through games and exercises in a safe, friendly atmosphere. Concepts include spontaneity, listening, storytelling and character building. Learn quick responses, build confidence and enhance public speaking skills and creativity. There is no pressure to be funny, just have fun! The teacher of this class studied improv. with *The Groundlings* and is a veteran of *Comedy Central*.

<u>Animal Improv.</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	BOURNES
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Is it possible to create a story from a one-word prompt? In this class, we'll learn how! Using animals as our inspiration, actors will play short-term games like bus-stop, freeze and four corners to build up to a long-form story. Physical and vocal choices will help expand the vocabulary of the performers. This class will also help students get comfortable being in front of an audience, and working with scene partners.

<u>Introduction to Film Studies</u> \$165	P1 (Gr. 5-8)	SCHREINER
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Movies have their own language and grammar, but movies are not made of letters and written words; they are made of light, sound and speech. In this class, Mr. Schreiner will help us learn the language of film so we can 'read' and appreciate movies. Our typical week will begin with an introductory activity to set context for the movie or clip we'll view. We'll discuss what we've seen, and then do a response activity, such as re-write a scene, write a review, cast a sequel, or make a storyboard.

<u>Magic in the Theater</u> \$165	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	BOURNES
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Come join this class to learn the magic of theater! Using a variety of theater games, we'll develop vocal, movement, performance and character building skills. As the class develops, we will practice, cast and perform classic scenes from shows such as Annie, Peter Pan and Oliver Twist. Let's bring a show to life from page to stage!

<u>Movie Make-Up Magic</u> \$180	P4 (Gr. 5-8) P5 (Gr. 5-8)	LOPEZ
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Lights, Camera, Action! Look behind the scenes and learn how to recreate movie make-up techniques! Be introduced to studio and special effects make-up. Learn make-up application, disguises, gashes, cuts, head wounds, and age lines. Learn how to create the illusions of the silver screen.



<u>South Pas. Players</u> \$165	P5 (Gr. 5-8)	BOURNES
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Modeled after shows like SNL and The Mickey Mouse Club, students will explore sketch comedy writing and performance. We'll start by learning the history of sketch, then jump right in and begin compiling sketches. Students will work together in small ensemble groups to build a unique show that represents the group. We will practice and develop our shows like professionals, with cold reads, casting, and dress rehearsals. Get a taste of the world of comedy!

Arts - Visual

<u>3D Sketches With Shading & Value</u> \$175	P4 (Gr. 5-8) P5 (Gr. 5-8)	VARDANIAN
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Are your sketches looking a little flat? Discover the world in 3D by learning how to bring your sketches to life! In this class, you will learn the art in value and shading. Through teacher demonstrations and lessons, students will learn techniques on how to add depth and dimension to their sketches. We will begin by creating a value scale, developing our skills through the four-week course. Your sketches will never look flat again!



<u>Artistic Styles in Ceramics</u> \$360 (2-period class)	P3-4 (Gr. 5-8)	PINEDA
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Let your imagination loose as we explore the many amazing styles of famous artists to create works of art in clay. We'll learn a variety of ceramic building methods, textures, glazes, and decorating techniques, while being inspired by Picasso's Cubism, Salvador Dali's Surrealism, Van Gogh's Impressionism, and more.

<u>Designing Aliens, Monsters & Super Heroes</u> \$175	P1 (Gr. 5-8)	HOLDRIDGE
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This class is for you if you love drawing scary monsters, strange aliens or flying dragons and want to learn more about character design. You will learn the basic techniques of drawing, texturing, shading, inking, and coloring. From start to finish, you will create your very own unique monster, alien or superhero, and the world they live in!



<u>Digital Photography</u> \$180	P2 (Gr. 5-8) P3 (Gr. 5-8)	MEDINA
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What makes a photograph impactful, influential, or emotional? We will study photographic works and learn compositional techniques, such as the rule of thirds. We will practice lighting, learn depth of field, and shutter speed. We will practice our skills on various projects focusing on shape, form, texture, pattern, and color. Bring your own SLR camera, or phone camera with setting control app. Show your best works at the end of Summer exhibition.

<u>Drawing & Pastel Painting Workshop</u> \$180	P2 (Gr. 5-8)	VARDANIAN
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Have fun exploring different drawing techniques this summer. Create scenery in perspective using pastels, dramatic figure drawings using charcoal, and beautifully observed still life drawings in pencil. You will advance your skills in using the elements of art, line, shape, value and color. You will also learn how to incorporate the principles of design in your drawings through the study of master artists. All new drawing projects this Summer!

<u>Duct Tape Creations</u> \$180	P3 (Gr. 5-8) P4 (Gr. 5-8)	DE LA VEGA
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In this class you can have all sorts of fun with one of the most amazing things ever invented—Duct Tape! Students will learn how to make wallets, flowers, binder pages and many other items out of colorful duct tape and tape with various patterns. Fun for girls and boys, this class will teach students cutting, folding and other techniques as they design and create with their own hands. For advanced students, we will create beach bags, flip-flops, shoes and more.

Arts - Visual

<u>Filmmaking</u> \$175	P3 (Gr. 5-8) P4 (Gr. 5-8) P5 (Gr. 5-8)	BAYDALINE
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Join us for an introduction to filmmaking, from film inception to execution, with emphasis on production. We'll learn storyboarding and screenwriting, and equipment and crew roles. Clips from various films will demonstrate tools and techniques a filmmaker can use to further storytelling. Returning students will take on leadership roles in the class. Students will collaborate in "production companies" on the production of final live-action short films, which we'll screen at our annual First Look Film Festival. We'll have popcorn and Redvines, and parents, you're invited!

<u>Fun with Ceramics</u> \$360 (2-period class)	P1-2 (Gr. 5-8)	PINEDA
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Make a variety of hand-built artworks using clay. We will explore various methods of building such as slab, pinch and coil, and then decorate them using colorful glazes and techniques. Projects will include usable items such as cups, bowls and planters. We'll also dive deep into our imaginations to mold more creative works of art. Take home everything you make!

<u>Oil Pastel Art</u> \$175	P1 (Gr. 5-8)	VARDANIAN
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The world is a colorful place, and what better way to depict it than through oil pastel art! Students will learn the basic oil pastel techniques while creating vibrant abstract and still life portraits. Students will learn how to blend, highlight, mix and shadow an array of colors using various pressure techniques, tricks and tips. Imagination and creativity awaits. Come help create a more bright and colorful world!

<u>Paint Like the Masters</u> \$175	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	HOLDRIDGE
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Discover the exciting world of watercolor, tempera, and acrylic painting! In this class, you will learn to do expressive landscape, portrait, and still life paintings by studying the work of famous artists like Monet, Picasso and Van Gogh. Through teacher demonstrations, you will learn how to use different painting techniques and color palettes. Have fun creating masterpieces in the style of the American Realists, French Impressionists and Surrealists, and many more!

<u>Painting & Drawing</u> \$180	P2 (Gr. 5-8) P3 (Gr. 5-8)	BILODEAU
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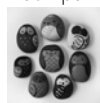
This popular class returns! Students will paint with watercolors, oil pastels, tempera, and other media. They will learn to mix colors, master basic drawing techniques, and construct tessellations. Students will also review and appreciate the works of accomplished classical and modern artists. To benefit returning students, a variety of new projects will be available for all, including Australian Art, Pre-Colombian pyramids, Pop Art and Self-Portraits.

<u>Portrait Practice</u> \$175	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	VARDANIAN
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Sketching the human face and its features is a skill worthy of mastering! This art class invites artists and non-artists to learn how to draw facial features, such as the eyes, nose, mouth, ears and hair. Artists will practice drawing themselves, family and friends, and their favorite celebrity. Students will also practice drawing faces of different ages.

<u>South Pasadena Rocks</u> \$170	P2 (Gr. 5-8)	HOLDRIDGE
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Rock painting is super fun and great for all ages! Each week we will do designs based on a different theme, such as animals, mandalas, faces, words and houses, using a variety of techniques and materials. Be part of the 'kindness campaign', where kids are painting rocks and placing them around town for people to find to help brighten their day!



Band, Beats & Orchestra

<u>Beats For Beginners</u> \$165	P5 (Gr. 5-8)	AVILA
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Do you love music and have always wanted to create your own beats? This class will give you the tools you need to learn the basics of creating your own beats and sampling. This class will be hands-on. We will learn song structure, basic music theory, and explore various music genres and beats.

<u>Beginning Band</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 5-6)	CRAWFORD
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Come learn a band instrument for the first time! This class is intended for incoming 5th & 6th graders who wish to get a head start on learning their flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, or percussion instruments. Bring your own instrument and become a musician!

<u>Concert Band</u> \$165	P1 (Gr. 6-8)	CRAWFORD
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Do you want to continue to play your instrument over the summer? Join us for band fun and your parents will not have to nag you to practice daily. Students will play a variety of music with the full band. This will be an enriching musical experience!

<u>DJ Summer class</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	AVILA
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Get hands-on lessons in the skills of a DJ! In this class, you'll get to see a real turntable up close and even play vinyl records. Students will learn music theory, beat matching, song structure, basic scratches, the history of the DJ, and analog and digital DJ technology. We will use mixing software on Chromebooks to mix our very own music. Come check out what it takes to be like today's DJ pros!

<u>Drumming & Percussion</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 5-8) P3 (Gr. 5-8)	VICTORY
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Stomp in and catch the rhythm, beat on drum sets and other percussion instruments. In this class, students will learn the basics of drumming, drum sets, stomp, and drum line and percussion instruments. Learn how to read beginner drum music, and create rhythms for drumbeats. Perform your beats in a school concert, marching band or drum line! Drum sets will be provided and shared.

<u>Jazz Band</u> \$165	P3 (Gr. 7-8)	CRAWFORD
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Come join us for our summer jazz ensemble, following in the footsteps of Duke Ellington and other famous Jazz artists. This class is open to trumpet, trombone, saxophone, flute, clarinet, piano, guitar, and bass guitar. Students should have strong musical skills but no jazz experience is necessary. Focus will be on improvisation and jazz styles.

<u>Musical Maniacs</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 5-8)	ROSAS
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If you're obsessed with the musical "Hamilton", find your posse of other musical theater maniacs. Students will read, watch, and discuss different musicals or excerpts of musicals, sing/act out selected scenes, and then put on a performance at the end. Students will analyze dialogue, lyrics and themes in a Socratic Seminar setting.

<u>String Orchestra</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	DIGGS
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In this beginning String Orchestra class, students will learn to care for, tune, and proficiently play one of the four orchestral string instruments: violin, viola, cello, or double bass. Orchestra students will also learn to read and compose, as well as critically analyze the music they will be playing and listening to. A wide variety of music is explored, as well as theory, music history, and ear training.

Cooking

<u>A Taste of Asia</u> \$175	P5 (Gr. 5-8)	SOTO
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Cooking skills are for life, and we will learn plenty about the world around us through this cultural and culinary tour of Asia. Learn to make some great Asian dishes from Boba to Spring rolls! You will become a pro in this hands-on class. We'll make a cookbook to take home at the end so you can wow your family and friends!

<u>Breakfast Club</u> \$175	P1 (Gr. 5-8)	SOTO
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Are you tired of your boring morning bowl of cereal and milk? Looking for new ways to spice up your breakfast? Breakfast is the most important meal of the day, so let's learn some new recipes for our morning grub! Whether it's a quick scrambled eggs or a fluffy pancake, you'll learn how to make all the best tasty breakfast treats!



<u>Let's Get Cooking</u> \$175	P2 (Gr. 5-8) P3 (Gr. 5-8)	SOTO
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This fun, interactive class will focus on preparing delicious after school snacks, such as cookies, dips, finger foods, and healthy snacks. Feed and impress your friends - and your mom and dad too! Students will learn the fundamentals of food preparation. We'll also make a cookbook to keep and use!

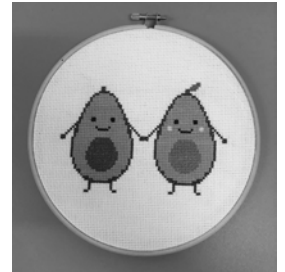
Sewing and Fiber Art

<u>Advanced Crochet</u> \$175	P2 (Gr. 5-8)	WONG
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From slip knot to chain stitch to single crochet! Learn the basics or continue to develop skills learned in Intro to Crochet. We'll keep learning to read and follow patterns. Students will be able to master basic crochet techniques while perfecting their own personal style.

<u>Cross-Stitch 101</u> \$175	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	NARRO
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Learn the basics of how to cross-stitch and let your creativity flow. In this class, you will learn how to separate stands from floss, read a cross-stitch chart, learn the basic cross-stitch, and how to finish a design. Students will be able to select from a variety of designs such as a favorite animal, text, or cartoon character to create a finished project. These make for great room decorations or presents to give to friends or family.



<u>Need to Knit</u> \$175	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	RYU
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This is a beginner knitting course. Students will learn to cast on, knit and purl. Projects will include items such as bookmarks, scarves, belts, bean bags, coasters, dishcloths, and envelope purses.

<u>Sewing for Beginners</u> \$360 (2-period class)	P1-P2 (Gr. 5-8)	BACHMAN
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Learn to sew! First, we will learn how to operate a sewing machine. With our new skills, we will work on projects like drawstring bags and backpacks, tote bag, a small quilt, bias skirt, snap bag and zipper bags. We will make pillows using the 'stitch and flip' method. As time permits, we will make a summer dress with elastic bodice, a scrap purse and eyeglasses cases. Learning to sew is not only fun and useful; sewing also helps develop logical thought processes and is a positive outlet for creativity.

<u>Sewing – Free Time</u> \$170	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	BACHMAN
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This one-hour class is only for students that are enrolled in Beginning or Advanced Sewing. Students will have more time and help completing the projects they start in their other sewing classes. There will not be new projects presented in this class.

<u>Sewing for Teens – Int/Adv</u> \$360 (2-period class)	P4-P5 (Gr. 5-8)	BACHMAN
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Develop your sewing skills further! Learn to use various sewing machine feet, such as a ruffle foot, gathering foot, and zipper foot. Learn various sewing techniques, and practice quilting. We will complete projects such as pillows, skirts, pajama pants, bags and fabric wallets. Students will also have the opportunity to request projects, based on a student's skill level and interest. Have fun learning, and enjoying the art and skill of sewing!

<u>Weaving, Macramé & Fiber Art</u> \$175	P4 (Gr. 5-8) P5 (Gr. 5-8)	GONZALEZ

Projects will include items such as wall and pot hangings, and wearable items like bracelets and pins. Get ready to get your decorating and fashion groove on!

Math / Games

<u>Jump Start to 7th Grade Math</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 7) P3 (Gr. 7)	CHEN
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Using Common Core curriculum, the objective of this class is to prepare students to be successful in Math 7. Students will gain a deeper understanding of number sense. We begin by looking into rational numbers (fractions, decimals, percents). Students will also increase their understanding of ratios, proportional relationships, and percent, and apply the knowledge to problem solving.

<u>Jump Start to 8th Grade Math</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 8) P5 (Gr. 8)	CHEN
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Using Common Core curriculum, the objective of this class is to prepare students to be successful in Math 8. Students will begin the course with a review of algebra, working with integers and their operations, then proceed to study properties of real numbers. We will also be exploring graphing linear equations, with an introduction to coordinate planes, ordered pairs, slopes, and slope-intercept forms.

<u>Jumpstart to Middle School</u> <u>Math Concepts</u> \$165	P3 (Gr. 6)	MASTERS

Science

<u>CSI Forensic Science</u> \$180	P1 (Gr. 6-8) P2 (Gr. 6-8) P3 (Gr. 5-6)	MUNIZ
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Learn how to collect evidence and determine what happened at a crime scene. Students will use chromatography, fingerprint analysis, and laboratory and forensics science techniques to solve mysteries. Learn practical applications of the scientific method and discover a new area of investigative science.

<u>Kitchen Chemistry</u> \$175	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	SOTO
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Did you know you could make butter out of whipped cream? Or pickles out of cucumbers? If you have curiosity about the wonders of delicious foods, this is the class for you. Join us for some hands-on science in the kitchen. In this activity-based class, we will explore the science behind your favorite foods and enjoy the fruits of our labor as well. Please come with a willingness to try new foods!

<u>Mars Imagery and Rocketry</u> \$180	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	FREEMAN
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Students will explore Mars from ground- and satellite-based missions including Opportunity, Curiosity, Maven, MRO and prior missions. Students will learn how to interpret satellite imagery and investigate the forces that shaped the surface features of Mars. Students will then explore the history of rocketry from early pioneers to the latest break-throughs in rocketry. We'll learn flight characteristics of paper rockets, in preparation for making a high pressure soda bottle rocket capable of sending an 'eggonaut' soaring above South Pasadena and returning safely to Earth. This class will challenge students to trouble-shoot design flaws, engineer solutions and potentially prepare them for Science Olympiad rocket competitions.



<u>Robotics – Intro to LEGO EV3 MINDSTORMS</u> \$360 (2-period class)	P1-P2 P3-P4 (Gr. 6-8)	WILLIAMS
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An exciting introduction to LEGO Robotics. Students work in teams to design, build and program EV3 LEGO robots to complete team challenges, rescue missions, solve mazes, and FIRST LEGO League challenges. Students will use 21st Century skills and apply the principles of STEM to learn in a fun and unique way.

Science

<u>Summer Robotics Academy</u> \$360 (2-period class)	P1-P2 (Gr. 5-6)	TULL
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Build and program your own robots at Summer Robotics Academy! Learn to build robots KIPR Robotics kits. Learn code to program your robots using a modified version of C. We will use math and science skills, and develop leadership, team building, critical thinking and creative problem solving, as we work on competition level projects. Returning students will continue to focus on programming using new sensors and cameras.

<u>Science Mythbusters</u> \$180	P3 (Gr. 5-8) P4 (Gr. 5-8) P5 (Gr. 5-8)	NG
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Explore science the Mythbusters way! We will use hands-on experiments to put myths to the test while using the scientific method, curiosity, hard work and ingenuity. This class will require you to use your academic skills, plus your imagination and creativity. Learn to use skills and develop processes to solve problems and learn to think like a scientist.



<u>Science Olympiad</u> \$360 (2-period class)	P1-P2 (Gr. 6-8)	FREEMAN
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Science Olympiad is bigger and better this year! In the first half of summer school, we will explore how bridges and boomilevers are engineered. Students will learn about trusses and arches, as well as how to efficiently distribute force. Students will design and build their own bridges and boomilevers out of balsa wood and put it to a stress test using Science Olympiad specifications and rules. The second half of the class is all about flight. We will build gliders powered by rubber bands and bottle rockets that carry "egg-o-nauts" to the sky. Students will develop the skills necessary to design and compete in flight events at the Los Angeles County Science Olympiad competition. This class requires dedicated and serious students interested in learning how to build advanced models with wood, super glue, tissue and other materials.

Skills for Success & Languages

<u>English Language Development (ELD) with Drama and Speech</u> \$125	P2 (Gr. 5-8)	RYU
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This English Language Development (ELD) class is designed to assist those students who are non-English speakers and for those with limited English language skills. Students will practice speaking skills, both conversational and academic, through drama, everyday conversations, popular songs, and public speaking. Students will utilize common idioms and conversational English, and gain confidence in their oral expression. ELD standards are addressed through classroom activities.

<u>Habla con Migo</u> \$165	P5 (Gr. 5-8)	DE LA VEGA
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In this course, students will learn basic Spanish such as describing people, days of the week, numbers, furniture and accessories, family members and food. Engagement activities include role playing, singing in Spanish, creating your own menu, family, crafts and activities.

<u>Leadership Academy</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 6-8)	GARCIA
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This class uses project-based learning and high-energy activities, engaging and encouraging students to be leaders with positive impact. Through storytelling, skits, fun play activities and more, students will learn strategies to increase confidence, get through awkward moments, deal with peer pressure, and become the leaders that schools and colleges are looking for.

<u>Public Speaking</u> \$165	P1 (Gr. 5-8)	BAYDALINE
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Learn the basics of public speaking. Build confidence as we practice vocal projection, gestures, posture, facial expression, eye contact (all aspects of non-verbal communication). Students will become more confident and will also improve their research and writing skills.

<u>Study Skills & Middle School Strategies</u> \$125	P3 (Gr. 6-8)	LUNA
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Join Ms Luna from SPMS to learn organizational and time management strategies that can help improve your study habits at school. This class will focus on learning to set SMART goals, as well as learning new skills to help prioritize student work load. Students will also learn techniques on stress management and gain experience in developing these skills to improve their performance at school.

<u>Team Building & Problem Solving</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	PATRICK J.
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Think your team can rebuild a Lego building from memory before the other team does? Think you can escape a floor maze? Learn from observing strategies of other teams, and build on this knowledge to find the right path. If you're interested in puzzles and strategy games then this class is for you: all you need is your creativity and problem solving. Carry objects from one side to another using only string. Participate in other Hands-On games that challenge you, as you compete for victory!

<u>The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens</u> \$125	P2 (Gr. 6-8)	LUNA
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Based on Stephen Covey's *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens*, this course helps to guide teens into developing healthy habits. The goal of this course is to help teens to build a stronger self-esteem, develop positive friendships, achieve SMART goals, have a better relationship with their parents, and much more. The 7 Habits are principles and tools that can help students both personally and academically.

Social Science

<u>Alexander Hamilton: Man, Myth or Legend?</u> \$165	P5 (Gr. 5-8)	ALVAREZ
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Alexander Hamilton and the other Founding Fathers are the stuff of legend, but really, they were ordinary people who did extraordinary things! Using the music and lyrics of "Hamilton" to guide us, we will delve deeper into the story of Hamilton and his time. Students will develop research and critical thinking skills while learning more about the people that shaped our nation. (The *Hamilton* soundtrack contains some explicit lyrics.)

<u>Geography through Baseball</u> \$165	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	DELGADILLO
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Baseball is played around the world, not just in the USA. Join avid baseball card collector and baseball historian, Mr. Delgadillo, in this journey around the world. We'll learn about several countries where baseball is played, about the people that play baseball around the world, plus interesting historical facts. World geography and history has never been so fun!

<u>History of American Culture through Baseball</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 5-8)	DELGADILLO
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In this class, we'll look at the evolving culture of America through the eyes of baseball, by incorporating such topics as the Civil Rights Movement, and the Evolution of Technology. To some, baseball is just a sport, however learning historical facts about baseball is a great way to learn about America. This class will be taught by Society for American Baseball Research Member and avid Baseball card collector, Mr. Delgadillo.

<u>Intro to Debate</u> \$165	P1 (Gr. 5-8)	LUNA
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This course provides an introduction to debate that will allow students to learn how to research a topic and debate the pros and cons of an argument with their peers. They will participate in weekly debates and gain a better understanding of the constructive ways to argue a point of view. Students will develop public speaking, critical thinking, teamwork and research skills.

<u>Mock Trial</u> \$165	P3 (Gr. 6-8)	ALVAREZ
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Students will learn about the judicial process as they try a fictitious case. Students will develop witness testimony, examination, and take part in a trial as a lawyer, witness, bailiff, clerk, or juror. Students will improve their analytical, listening and speaking skills while collaborating with other students as they learn about rules of evidence, practicing proper courtroom procedure, and devising case theory.

<u>Model United Nations</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	ALVAREZ
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Want to understand the system of the United Nations? Students will play the role of delegate to the UN from a member state such as the US, Japan, or Mexico, and debate contemporary global issues. Students will practice research techniques, and become more familiar with the history, culture and political structures of the many member states. Students will improve their abilities to debate, speak publicly, negotiate, resolve conflicts, compromise, cooperate, and build consensus.

<u>Pop Culture History</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	ROSAS
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Ever thought about the impact that historical events have had on pop culture? Students will use short documentaries, mini-lectures and academic discussion to analyze historical events and the impact they have had on pop culture. Students will create their own works of art in their choice of medium - art, memes, poetry, music, rap, or videos - that reflect the social, political and/or environmental state of our world today.

<u>Conjunction Junction</u> <u>What's your function?</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 6-7)	ROBERTS
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Get a head start and jump on board the grammar train! Common Core requires students to know and be able to identify the Eight parts of Speech. We'll be using some fun individual and group "challenge competitions" to help retain and apply knowledge about nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, prepositions, conjunctions, and interjections. Convention coverage such as punctuation, spelling and editing, will also be explored. Supplemental handouts, chromebook usage and A.V. material may be utilized in class.

<u>Creative Writing</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 5-6) P4 (Gr. 5-8) P5 (Gr. 5-8)	ANDERSON / WILL
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Creative writing is an exploration of fiction writing and poetry. Students will study the techniques of great authors, as well as discover their own voice as writers. In class, students will have a chance to share their work in a supportive environment and they will receive quality feedback from their peers and instructors.

<u>Creative Writing with Art & Music</u> \$170	P2 (Gr. 5-8)	BAYDALINE
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Join us for creative writing inspired by art and music. Draw inspiration for your writing by examining famous paintings, sculptures and listening to different styles of classical music. Learn the beauty of language, and learn to develop, nurture and prune an idea to fruition. We will find our voice as we practice writing descriptions, details, and emotions using a variety of styles, including short story, vignette and poetry. Take your work home in a portfolio to share. New art and music for returning students.

<u>Express Yourself Through Words</u> \$165	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	PATRICK J.
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Words are powerful, so let's use them! Students will participate in various spoken word and writing projects, including creating self-portraits using words that best describe ourselves, or filling in the blanks of poems with new sentences to give interpretations of a poem. Develop your writing and spoken word skills. Let's find our voice!

<u>Fairytales, Myths & Folklore</u> \$165	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	ANDERSON
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In this class, we'll be reading, watching, analyzing and writing about some of the greatest works of literature. Some titles include Cinderella, Hansel & Gretel, Hercules, and Paul Bunyon. Be ready to enjoy, discuss, and recreate some of the best tales of all time.

<u>Intro to Journalism</u> \$165	P3 (Gr. 5-8)	SCHREINER
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In this class, students will learn about journalism and develop as journalists, through an introduction to journalistic writing. Through analysis of news articles and clips, we will explore why each are impactful. Students will write their own articles and opinion pieces on news, arts, and entertainment.

<u>That is Totally True...Isn't It?</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 6-8)	CLARK
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If adults are being fooled by fake news and clickbait, how can we expect to know when we are being duped? Using a curated set of articles and texts, we will explore bias and how to tell what's true and what's false. Students will learn to be critical consumers of digital media, as well as honing their writing skills – both informational and persuasive – in our pursuit of the truth.

<u>Proficiency – Language Arts</u> \$125	P3 (5th Gr.) P2 (6th Gr.) P1 (7th Gr.) P2 (8th Gr.)	ANDERSON/WILL
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Proficiency classes are designed for students performing below grade level in a particular subject. Direct instruction, along with hands-on activities, will be used to reinforce grade-level English Language Arts Common Core standards. Students will learn tips, strategies and resources for success, such as pre-writing with graphic organizers, editing and publishing drafts, using 'thinking maps', and 'close reading' to aid comprehension. Get a deeper understanding of grade level content from the previous year and give your student a greater chance of success next school year.

<u>Reading Strategies</u> \$165	P1 (Gr. 6-7)	ROBERTS
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As students develop their reading skills, they also need to learn how to comprehend and remember what they have read. While focusing on poetry, a play, a short story and a novel, this class will aid students in understanding literary terms, figurative vs. literal language, and character/plot development. Do you wonder what it would be like to interview an athlete? In Sports Journalism, we will examine articles, TV reports and watch clips of the world's most impressive athletes to learn how to write for sporting publications, conduct interviews and master the basics of broadcasting.



<u>Writer's Notebook</u> \$165	P2 (Gr. 6-7) P3 (Gr. 7-8)	ROBERTS
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Learn to "hook" your reader, and polish your paragraph and essay writing skills. First, we'll understand the various types of writing we'll encounter in middle school. Then, using Common Core standards, we will learn how to cite and apply evidence based text, develop critical thinking skills, use inferencing, descriptive/transitional wording and summing up in a conclusion. Peer editing will be practiced. Media being covered will be short stories and a performance task article. Supplemental handouts, chromebook usage and A.V. material may be utilized.

<u>Graphic Design</u> \$170	P5 (Gr. 5-8)	SANDERS
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Everything is designed: This class is a fun and practical way to introduce your kids to this exciting skill. Students will become aware of the graphic design in their daily lives, and will learn how to design for themselves. Students will try a variety of programs for expressing their own creations. <u>Intro to Computer Science & Programming</u> \$170	P2 (Gr. 5-8) P3 (Gr. 5-8)	LEE
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This class introduces core computer science and programming concepts using self-guided and self-paced online resources such as code.org. We'll also have opportunities for hands-on coding using Sphero robots. No prior programming experience is needed. Learn to create programs to solve complex problems. By the end of the course, you will be able to create interactive games, stories, and art that you can share!

<u>Minecraft & Architectural Design</u> \$175	P4 (Gr. 5-8) P5 (Gr. 5-8)	LEE
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Learn to build 3-Dimensional, architecturally beautiful structures that duplicate real structures. We will travel through time, reviewing different styles, and then we will work together on our Summer Minecraft Server to build cities. Have fun and learn design by building.

<u>Photoshop</u> \$165	P4 (Gr. 5-8)	SANDERS
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Turn your photos into something extraordinary! Using cloud based editing programs like Photoshop and Pixlr, students will learn to edit, retouch, colorize and prepare photos for the web, plus more. Create text effects; learn how use digital effects to impress your teachers and family with dynamic reports and PowerPoints. Digital photos are everywhere – be a leader in how to maximize their impact.

6. All communications and computing equipment are the property of the District. As a result, users are not allowed to alter the configurations of individual computing devices without prior permission from the District.
7. Vandalism (including alteration of individual machine configurations) will result in cancellation of the user's privileges. Vandalism includes creating or distributing malware or maliciously attempting to harm District equipment, District materials or another user's data.
8. The user shall not attempt to interfere with other users' ability to send or receive electronic mail, nor shall she/he attempt to read, delete, copy, modify, or forge other users' email or files.
9. The user is expected to keep messages brief and use appropriate language.
10. In accordance with legal requirements, the District reserves the right to gain access to all information stored in District computers, or accessed, used, or retrieved by any user and, where appropriate, disclose and disseminate such information.
11. Violation of these rules and regulations may result in loss of user privileges or other disciplinary action including possible student suspension/expulsion or employee termination.
