## From the Pastor COVID-19 Updates

My dear brothers and sisters,

Following the 21-day statewide curfew beginning Friday November 19, it was reported that the City of Columbus and Franklin County will be under a stay-at-home advisory beginning Friday and lasting for 28 days, which would be Friday, December 18. This is an advisory, not an order. Still, in the interest of prudence and in the interest of helping to slow the spread we take this advisory seriously. For this reason, the following policies will be effective immediately.

### WORSHIP

Worship remains essential for us. Our current sacramental schedule including Mass, Adoration, Confession, and Baptisms will remain the same.

The 11:00am Sunday Mass will continue to be live-streamed on our YouTube and Facebook pages.

### ADORATION CHAPEL

The Adoration Chapel will remain open, but please remember to wear a face covering, keep socially distanced and sanitize your hands upon entering and exiting the chapel. A maximum of 6 people are permitted in the chapel at any time.

### PARISH OFFICE

### MEETINGS AND MINISTRY

All meetings at the parish are to be moved to virtual or postponed. While this is not an exhaustive list, this includes the Knights of Columbus, Bible Studies, Youth Ministry, Little Saints, and Men's Breakfast.

The Diocesan Recreation Association has announced that all basketball practices and games are postponed. Other extracurricular activities are canceled or held remotely.

### CHRISTMAS TREE LOT

The Christmas Tree Lot will remain open. Even though it is outdoors, everyone is still asked to keep socially distanced and wear a face covering when social distancing is not possible.
