

The ISR Quality and Safety Alliance ([ISRQSA](#)) meetings held during the RSNA again saw lively discussions and excellent attendance both onsite and remotely.

The meeting with the ISRQSA member campaigns has traditionally been a forum for mutual updates and peer-to-peer exchange on challenges and opportunities to raise awareness of medical radiation quality and safety. This year, the ISRQSA also wanted to learn about the three major goals of each “Safe” campaign, which provided valuable insights to guide the ISRQSA’s future strategy. It is planned to consolidate the goals categorized as “aspirational” to serve as a basis for the ISRQSA’s strategic agenda. In addition, the results of an ISR(QSA) survey on patient engagement conducted on the occasion of World Patient Safety Day 2023 were presented and have been made available on the ISRQSA website [here](#).

The ISRQSA also met with its international partners including WHO and IAEA as well as other major interprofessional organizations involved in radiation protection to exchange information on ongoing activities and explore avenues to strengthen and expand collaboration. WHO, e.g., informed of an ongoing survey on the status of imaging in Africa. IAEA is preparing its next major conference (2025) to review the first decade of the Bonn Call for Action and will reach out to the ISR in this regard.

The next ISRQSA meeting will be held during ECR 2024 (February 28 to March 3, Vienna).
