


Jason Clark is (NOT!) SF Bay Region Vice Chair

ELECTION THEFT



SF Bay Region delegates at the state convention are supposed to elect their vice chair for the state party.




The state party knew Jason Clark had a close re-election against energetic and popular Yvette Corkrean.

The state party stole the election from Yvette. They broke bylaws to appoint supporters of Jason Clark as delegates.

1. The old Alameda Co. chair, Hugh Bussell, *who endorsed Jason Clark*, made appointments that should have been made by the new chair, David Chan. State Executive Director Bryan Watkins told the delegates to keep the appointments. (-5 delegates)
2. **A Contra Costa Co. assembly nominee, Joe Rubay, replaced a delegate with Jeanne Solnordal, *who endorsed Jason Clark*. (-1)**
3. An Alameda Co. assembly nominee with an open appointment, Bob Brunton, had the appointment made for him. (-1 delegate)

The party swung 7 votes to put Jason Clark ahead by 4. Observer Shawn Steel promised not to certify the result, but Bryan Watkins declared Jason Clark the winner.
