CHRIST IN CRISIS:

Why We Need to Reclaim Jesus by Jim Wallis

A timely book discussion for September

Last fall author, theologian and activist Jim Wallis came to Milwaukee and talked with us about his book, *Christ in Crisis*. We had a church-full at Immanuel to hear him. Now we have an opportunity to read his book together and talk with one another about it. The Session has invited the Rev. John Helt to guide this discussion:

"I first read and met Jim in the 1970s, when Sojourners was a new magazine and alternative Christian community in Washington, D.C., and I was a seminarian in St Louis. I have long appreciated his skill in applying a biblical prophetic message to current political issues. He consistently critiques the Church and the Right for forgetting about Jesus and the Left for abandoning its spiritual heritage.

We will be fresh off two national political conventions and moving into the final stretch of a long and ugly political season in September. I cannot imagine a more engaging conversation partner than Jim Wallis for the Immanuel church family next month. I look forward to gathering with you and talking together about the two hot-button topics never to be discussed in polite company: Religion and Politics!"

PRESBYTERIANS CALLED TO RESPOND TO RACISM

The Stated Clerk of the Presbyterian Church (USA), J. Herbert Nelson, has urged that when it comes to racism, Presbyterians can “no longer hide behind being too controversial” saying that the church is called to “dismantle structures that put people in poverty and pain.” The PCUSA Office of Public Witness in Washington, D.C. distributed an “Action Alert” recently to provide a way for Presbyterians to reach out to lawmakers to ask them to address racism in the U.S.
