If you are "visiting" Immanuel Church today, we welcome you to Milwaukee's first church, marking its 183rd anniversary this year! Today's congregation of over 500 members comes from next door, neighborhoods throughout the city, and as far north as Port Washington, as far south as Kenosha, and as far west as Summit. Committed to "keeping faith in the city," Immanuel supports the Interchange Food Pantry and is active with Milwaukee Habitat for Humanity and Southeastern Wisconsin Common Ground. Global mission projects reach to Zambia and Cuba. Worship is our first priority and education is emphasized for all ages. The Session has studied and deliberated a timeline for re-opening the church to inperson worship. Multiple sources of information have been consulted, from the CDC and State of Wisconsin phase-to-phase gating criteria to local and denominational guidelines specific to reopening churches. The elders and ministers have studied these resources and listened to members via several virtual "coffee hours"; they have discussed, pondered, prayed. The unanimous decision has been made to extend on-line worship at least through Labor Day weekend, and

continue to develop plans for reopening the church building to all persons when that is determined to be safe and responsible. #### PRESBYTERIANS CALLED TO RESPOND TO RACISM

The Stated Clerk of the Presbyterian Church (USA), J. Herbert Nelson, has urged that when it comes to racism, Presbyterians can "no longer hide behind being too controversial" saying that the church is called to "dismantle structures that put people in poverty and pain." The PCUSA Office of Public Witness in Washington, D.C. distributed an "Action Alert" this week to provide a way for Presbyterians to reach out to lawmakers to ask them to address racism in the U.S.

# SUMMER ONLINE READING GROUP: Siddhartha by Hermann Hesse

with Dr. Gregory Baer, Professor of German at Carthage College **Wednesday evenings July 1, 8, 15** + 7:00-8:00 in your favorite chair

In 1946, Hermann Hesse was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature. At the award ceremony in Stockholm, Sigurd Curman, President of the Royal Academy of Sciences, remarked on Hesse's ability to use literature to battle the nefarious ideas that infected much of the world and led to a world war: "Hermann Hesse has carried on his battle against these microbes of the soul in the field of literature. He has endeavored, in his stylistically exquisite poems and stories, to show us the way to rise out of this slough. He shouts to all of us ... 'advance, mount higher, conquer yourself!' For to be human is to suffer an incurable duality, to be drawn toward both good and evil. And we can achieve harmony and peace only when we have killed the selfishness within us. This is Hesse's message to the people of a ravaged age...." What messages do Hesse's writings have for us in our ravaged age?

Hesse's novel, *Siddhartha*, tells the story of a Brahmin's son who explores intellectualism, aestheticism, discipleship, lust, wealth, and human connections as he seeks to overcome selfishness and find deep and lasting satisfaction and enlightenment. We will read this novel together and discuss—drawing on Siddhartha and Hesse—the roles these topics play in our modern lives as we seek to be people of faith exploring the ambiguities of modern life and discerning the responsibilities and opportunities to which God calls us in each new day.

Participants will meet via "Zoom" on Wednesday evenings through July 15, 7:00-8:00.
