Communion from the Reserved Sacrament

Sundays from 1:00 - 2:00 PM Beginning Sunday, September 6, 2020

Good Shepherd Episcopal Church 400 Seabrook Road, Tequesta

As we begin Level 1 of our reopening process, we are now able to make communion available on Sundays at Good Shepherd, even before we phase into in-person worship.

This is an opportunity to come back to church, in a very limited time frame, to drink in atmosphere of the sanctuary and receive the bread. Because this is going to be very different from what you are used to, we would like to describe the process so you will know exactly what to expect.

ARRIVAL

- Masks are required at all times. If you forget your mask please tell an usher.
- When you arrive, we require social distancing. No hugging or shaking hands.
- There will be an usher outside to take temperatures and form a **distanced** line for entry. If your temperature is above 100.4 you will not be admitted to the building.
- Family groups can proceed together through the queue.

INSIDE

- Entry is counted and timed. An usher will direct you to proceed to the next area.
- The spaced line will proceed down the center aisle of the sanctuary.
- Pews are *not* open for seating.
- There is time for prayer and reflection while you are in the church, music softly playing on the organ.
- You will receive communion (bread only) from Fr. Doug in the chapel and then exit through the chapel door on the north side of the building.
- The duration of this experience, once you're in the church, will be 5-10 minutes.

AFTER COMMUNION

- Please don't gather in groups outside your own family after exiting the building.
- The campus is not open for gatherings.

As we progress to Level 2 of reopening, we will begin a reservation process for worship services with limited attendance, scheduled to begin on Sunday, September 20, with one service at 10:00 AM along with live streaming.
